SITE SELECTION NOT RESTRICTED, DECLARES HINES

SALT LAKE CITY, July 28.—(AP) Major-General Frank T. Hines, head of the United States Veterans' bureau and member of a sub-committee on selection of hospital and soldiers' homesites, stopped here today en route to Oregon, where he will inspect sites for a soldiers' home.

The terms of the allocation for the Oregon home, he said, confine it to the territory south of the line of Portland and west of the Cascades. He indicated he would visit several cities in that region and look over sites offered. Since no funds have been appropriated for purchases of sites, he said, if a suitable site is chosen it will be turned over to the government without cost.

While Roseburg and Eugene, Oregon, are the most active candidates for the soldiers' home, General Hines said the selection is not restricted to those cities.

BASSETT'S BONES NOT DISCOVERED

EVERETT, Wash., July 28.—(AP) —bones dug from an old graveyard by a group of boys stood revealed today as those found in a sack in the water off an Edmonds dock Sunday, whose finding led to suspicions they might be those of the long-missing James Eugene Bassett.
