MEDFORD PEARS FETCH PREMIUM PORTLAND MART

PORTLAND, Ore., July 29.—(AP)—While later butter receipts have been somewhat increased over the same period last week, a decrease in centralizer output is suggested from latest reports.

Generally strong prices are reflecting in the market for live chickens with prices firm to higher in spots. Demand is unusually keen for light weight broilers and heavy weight hens.

While only a fairly steady tone is reflected for ordinary stuff, quality light weight chickens are showing a good demand, reports Carl Rutenber of Portland Produce.

There is an excellent demand for northwest cantaloupes at practically steady prices here in the market. The latter are especially depressed with most of the good stuff going as low as 9c lb.

Best seedless grapes are finding a fair call; mostly around \$1.25. Quality lettuce is very scarce with prices very firm.

Green bean market is almost stagnant. Every demand remains fairly favorable with prices retained.

Early apples continue in good call at recent prices. Tomatoes are weaker and again lower-priced. Stocks increasing. Potatoes and onions are unchanged.

REQUIRE PERMITS FOR TRAVEL THRU PARTS OF FOREST

Word has been received from the regional forester that the following area within the Crater National forest is closed to travel, except with permit issued by the local forest officer, but no permit shall be required of any actual settler going to or from his home.

An area of approximately 119,000 acres in Tn. 33, 33 and 34 S., R. 4 and 5 E., W. M., the boundary of which is described as follows: Beginning at Lodgepole Guard station, in Sec. 32, T. 33 S., R. 4 E., W. M., thence along south and east sides of road to Innaha Guard station, thence north along trail to Bessie Rock, thence northwesterly approximately one mile to Red Blanked creek, thence up Red Blanked creek to Dry Creek-Union Peak trail, thence southeasterly along west side of said trail approximately four miles thence south over summit of Ruth, Ethel and Maude mountains to Boston Bluff mountain, thence southwesterly approximately four miles to a point one-half mile west of Lake Alta, thence southerly along ridge to summit of Lucifer mountain, thence southerly along Cascade summit to a point one mile north of Clinnaman guard station, thence west to the southwest corner of Section 36, T. 34 S., R. 4 E., W. M., thence southeasterly over Blue Rock to the Rustler Peak-Blue Canyon trail, thence along said trail to the Cascade summit, thence following summit to Mt. McLoughlin, thence south westerly to Rye Springs, thence south along Rye Springs trail to Fish Lake-Lake of the Woods road, thence westerly along north side of said road to its intersection with the east line of Section 36, T. 36 S., R. 3 E., W. M., thence north along township lines to Butte Falls-Lodgepole road, thence northeasterly along said road to place of beginning."
