BUSHER GRABS HIT 46 STRAIGHT DAYS TOPPLING RECORD

INDEPENDENCE, Kansas.—(AP)—Hitting safely in 46 consecutive games, "Babe" Myer, diminutive Independence outfielder, has set a Western association record which surpasses any major league slugger's achievement.

Myer fell short of the minor league mark, however, Joe Wilhoit, with Wichita in the Western league, hit safely in 66 consecutive games in 1919.

Questioned about his consistent hitting, Myer said he always approaches the plate with an attitude of nonchalance and freedom from worry.

"I never swing hard," he explained, "just pick out the ball I want to hit and try to meet it with a good wrist snap."

"If I attempted to use a body swing I couldn't hit the ball past the pitcher."
