

BARTHLSVILLE, Okla-(AP)-New uses for natural gas, flowing from the earth at the rate of trillions of cubic feet annually, are being sough by the experiment station of the United States Bureau of Mines here

by the experiment statistic due United States Bureau of Mines nete. Among the products already being derived from natural gas, fuelf a by-product of crude oil production, are perfumes, moth balls, motor fuels, explosives, stochols, dys, in-ectificial rubber. Once allowed to blow free, today the gas not only brings the oll 50 the surface, but also is useful in producing heat, power and light. It yields gasoline under treatment. The experiment station is con-cerned particularly with the pyroly-sis of natural gas, or its decomposi-tion into carbon and hydrogen. Both have commercial uses, while other by-products of the process can be utilized profitably.
