

### CHAS. PRAY, CHIEF OF CONSTABULARY, ON INITIAL VISIT

Charles P. Pray, superintendent of the new state police department, with headquarters in Salem, arrived in Medford today to confer with Lee Brown, constabulary chief in southwestern Oregon and other state police stationed in this district.

"The organization is progressing rapidly," Superintendent Pray stated, "and I find the work of the staff quite satisfactory." He spoke highly of the work of Privates James O'Brien and E. W. Van der Walker, who last week arrested Ed F. Rice, known as "Tough Eddie," confessed robber of a service station at Ashland. The police arrested the man a half hour after the crime.

Captain Harry M. Niles of the Portland police bureau and Captain Rexford of the Multnomah county sheriff's traffic force, will arrive in Medford about the first of September to conduct the school of instruction for members of the local department, the state head announced. The two captains will be assisted by two local men, who have not been selected as yet.

No definite period has been set for the instruction, but will be held until the officers have been given a complete training. The school is being conducted in three headquarters cities, Portland, Medford and Baker.

Superintendent Pray said that he had no new plans to announce at the present time. He left headquarters in Salem yesterday, and conferred with officers in Roseburg en route south.

### CUBAN CASUALTIES MOUNT IN REVOLT; MANY IMPRISONED

HAVANA, Aug. 12.—(AP)—Casualties in the last four days of revolt in Cuba were figured today from scattering dispatches and official communications at 36 dead and 53 wounded.

The reports indicated government losses have been slight and that prisoners taken up to today numbered more than 150.

No military engagements were reported today from anywhere on the island since last night's two skirmishes in the province of Pinar del Rio where the government said, 19 rebels were killed and 28 wounded.

Lieutenant-Colonel Escamio Delgado, once a special military judge, was sent last night on a secret mission to Santa Clara and today 150 soldiers followed him.

Numbered among the dead are one rural guardsman and one policeman. The rest, excepting three "bystanders" are classified as insurgents.
