because it might add to their taxes. The governor, a rich man informs the "vast wealth" that he too pays taxes in the higher brackets, and advises them "not to oppose that which is for the general welfare and safety."

The voice of Governor Huey Long, down in Louisiana, with its vague suggestion of a voice from the tomb of Lenin, may prompt the best minds to permit their richest government to do something.

That "go and get it" observation is unpleasant to the capitalist ear.

Michigan police, thanks chiefly to the head of Henry Ford's own police, caught three murderers in the morning, and that afternoon, baffling lynching mobs, a Michigan judge had the three on their way to life imprisonment.

Each man was convicted of four murders, each sentenced to four consecutive life sentences.

Michigan, refusing to disgrace herself by imitating the murderer, has no capital punishment. It is to be hoped that the four life sentences will keep the atrocious criminals in jail.

They murdered two girls, fifteen and seventeen years old, and their two high-school boy companions. After the murders, of which the details are too horrible for narration, the four bodies were buried in the car, in which the bandits trapped them.

These murderers were not the "foreigners" upon whom we are too much inclined to put the blame for our crime wave. One was a negro, thirty-one, the others, while American youths, nineteen and twenty-two years old.

Innate viciousness, and the crime

wave multiplied tenfold by prohibition and bootlegging are responsible for the horror. The murderers had trailed the four boys and girls as they drove from a roadside inn, to park their car, and insert their ghastly fate.

OPTIMISTIC NOTE WALL ST. BROKERS

NEW YORK, Aug. 15.—(AP)—The stock market finished a week of reviving bullishness with a further moderate advance today, in face of week-end profit taking.

Stocks were helped by a somewhat irregular upturn in bonds, and moderately firmer commodities. Business and trade news, however, was meagre.

Week-end reports from the steel trade generally anticipated the beginnings of a mild seasonal upturn.

In view of the extent of the recovery in shares, this week, brokerage advice was somewhat less uniformly bullish today than they were yesterday. Some commission houses advised their customers that the success of the bull campaign will depend on the character of the business and trade reports during the near future, but others were quite optimistic.

Detectives Pass Disguise Tests PEIPING, Aug. 15.—(UP)—Two hundred Chinese detectives in Peiping have successfully passed the tests for disguising themselves imposed by the commissioner of safety, General Pao Yu-lin. They dressed as peddlers, water-carriers, peasants, and even as working women. One detective, dressed as a garbage collector, smelled so successfully that he was turned away from police headquarters.

Old Cigar Relic Found. VIRGINIA CITY, Aug. 15.—(UP)—A striking relic of the old Comstock days was unearthed here by Albert Dressler, of Berkeley, a souvenir hunter, when he found an imitation glass cigar five feet long that was used to advertise a famous cigar store 50 years ago. The device, forerunner of modern electric signs, was lighted with gas and is constructed of 15,000 to 20,000 glass prisms.
