APPLIGATE AREA  
MAY BE CLOSED  
ACCOUNT HAZARD

F. H. Brundage, assistant regional forester in charge of fire control, who is spending several days here from his Portland headquarters looking over the fire situation of the forest, conferred this morning with heads of departments of the Crater National forest relative to a possible closing of the Appligate district to all visitors from now on until rains put an end to the fire hazard.

The outcome of the discussion was that another 10 days' trial would be given, and that the district would not be closed in that time, providing no new disastrous fires broke out. The Appligate is a popular recreational center, and the forestry officials will not close it unless absolutely necessary.

The district is so excessively dry that it is a great forest fire hazard, and most of the large fires in the Crater forest have started there this summer. In several of these fires, ranch property was destroyed and other ranches threatened.

Up to noon today the Crater National forest territory was still free from any new forest fires, and the old fire burning since Sunday in the Deming creek section of the Appligate district, was in such satisfactory control that but 8 out of the 120 fire fighters that had been working on it this week were left at the scene today.

Things were so quiet today in the forest headquarters office that the office attaches much enjoyed the long-wanted breathing spell, and Carl Janouch, assistant supervisor, presided at the phone switchboard which is connected up with all the lookout stations, while F. H. Brundage, assistant regional supervisor, and Norman White, deputy forest supervisor, went to the fire on the Owen-Oregon owned land near Butte Falls to give the new caterpillar fire fighting device its first trial.

According to information obtained from the forest office late this forenoon this fire was checked last evening. The new caterpillar is equipped with a plow attachment, which it is thought will be useful in fighting fires, as it plows a deep furrow and could plow furrows around the outskirts of a forest fire as a starter for the fire fighters, which they could enlarge and embank quicker. It was intended to give the especially equipped caterpillar a thorough trial at the Butte Falls fire today.
