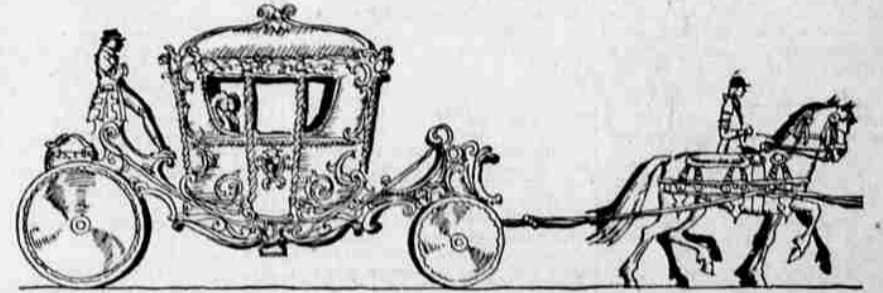
Treasure Hunt Is Friday Event For 50 Young People

Extensive Program to Be Carried Out By Medford Group
