FEAR EPIDEMICS WILL RAGE WHEN

Yangtse Flood Probably Greatest Calamity of Modern Times-Unknown Thousands Die in Waters

destruction and desolation rode the crest of flood waters down the Yaugtse river today causing probably the greatest calamity in modern times.

Unknown thousands had succumb ed to watery deaths, destitute scores died daily of dysentery and typhoid while medical authorities warned that with the receding of the water, probably several weeks hence,

water, promoty several weeks nemo-serious epidemics will rage.

Upwards of 30,000,000 persons were said to have been made homeless by the unprecedented surge of water-in the valley. In the Wuhan cities Hankow, Wuchang and Hanyang, alone 400,000 refugees were counted.

Many had been removed to places more safe by the military, but other thousands refused to move, convinced that Hankow is doomed, refusing to help themselves or be helped and only sit on their nearly submerged roots. sit on their nearly submerged rawaiting the inevitable touch

Thousands Boomed.

Authorities were agreed that they were unable to cope with the stupendous needs for emergency relief pendous needs for emergency relief.
Many thousands were doomed, they
said, unless immediate relief arrives,
chambers of commerce and benevolent societies aupplied small amounts
of foodstuffs, all obtainable, while
employes of the water works went
about in boats serving roof sitters
and preventing them from drinking
fifthy flood water.
However, these services merely
touched the fringe of the problem.
