Cat Chews Chicken Thief

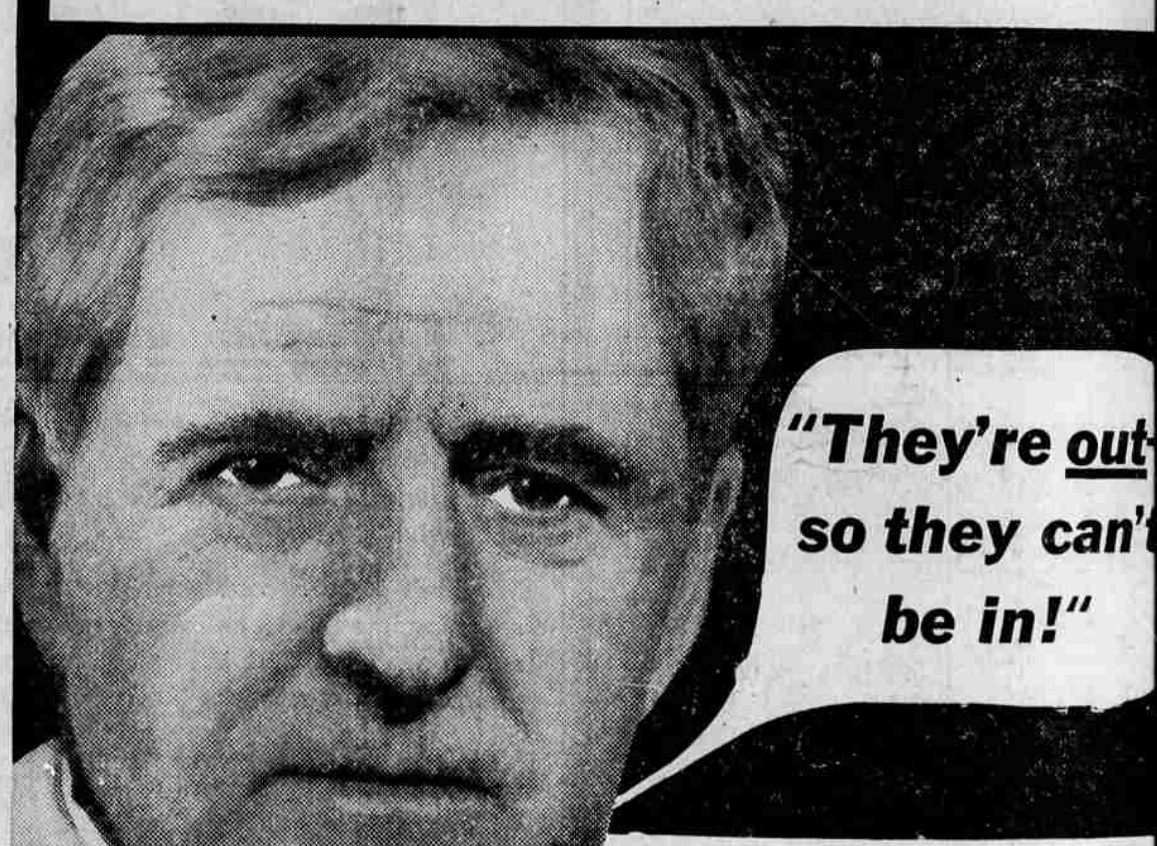
