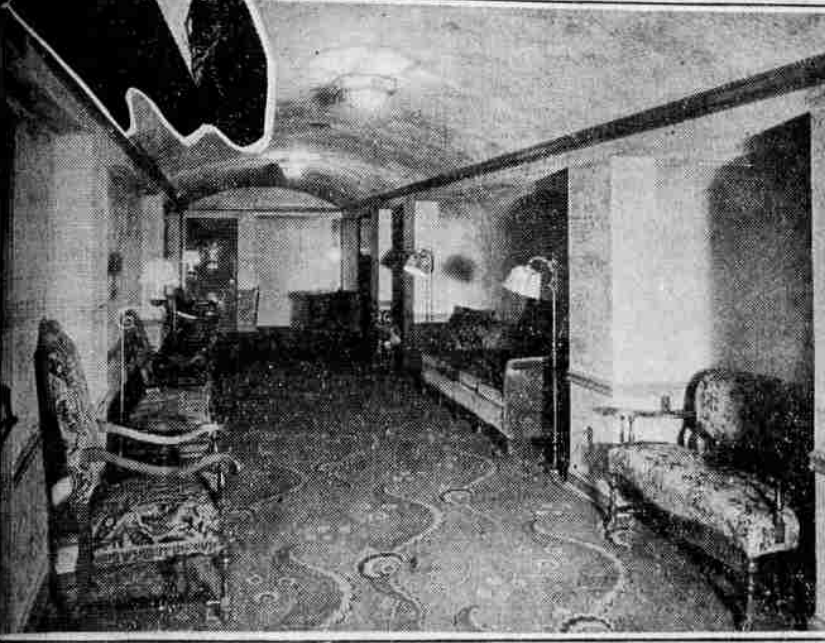
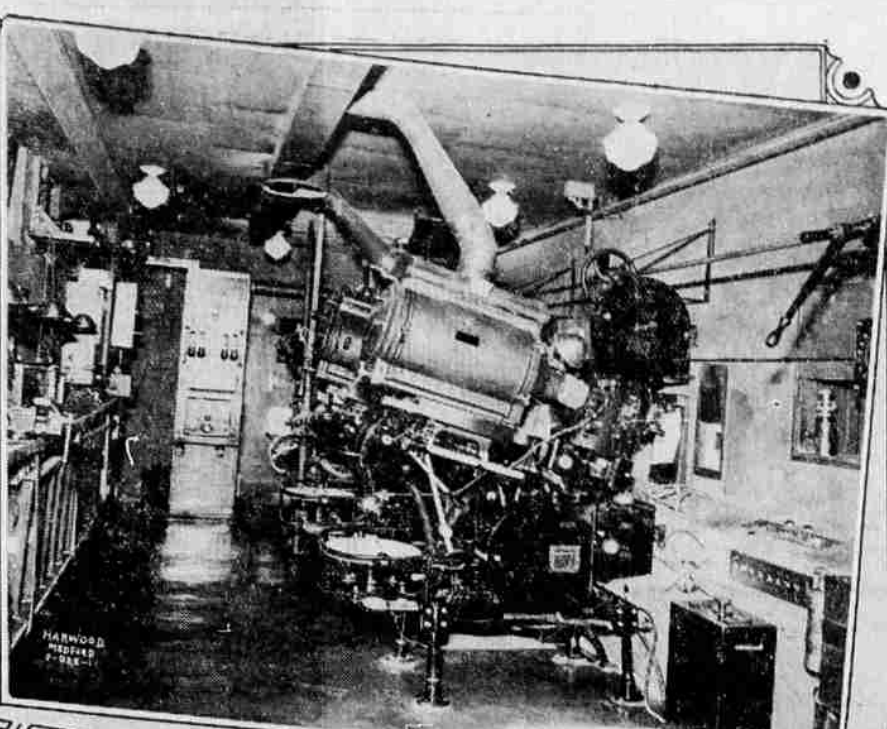


# Holly Theatre Celebrates First Anniversary in Medford
