ROSEBURG CHOICE AIDS PRESTIGE OF CON. W. C. HAWLEY

Veteran Solon Gets Word Of Selection On Visit Here—Benefit Seen For Entire Southern Oregon Area.

Congressman W. C. Hawley, in attendance at the Oregon Reclamation Congress in session, spent yesterday and today renewing old acquaintances in the city and valley. He called on many local citizens he has known for 30 years. It was here, late yesterday that the congressman announced he had received a telegram from General Elmer, administrator of the veterans' bureau, stating that the president had approved the recommendation of Roseburg as a site for the veteran's hospital. The telegram was relayed from Salem by long distance telephone, by his secretary.

Congressman Hawley made no comment, save to say, "I believe Roseburg is the choice of 95 per cent of the people of Oregon."

Backed Roseburg
The selection of Roseburg adds to the high prestige of Congressman Hawley, as he backed Roseburg for the hospital, from the start and made a sterling fight for his choice in the face of bitter lobby opposition.

The victory of Roseburg met with general favor in this city and valley.

Congressman Hawley declared that the selection would be beneficial to all the southern Oregon country.

The veteran Oregon solon will leave for Washington, D. C., early in November to make ready for the opening of congress in December, and resume his duties as chairman of the powerful ways and means committee. He is also head of the Republican party committee, delegated to make a selection of a candidate for speaker of the house.

Sees Business Revival
Congressman Hawley feels that fall and winter trade and buying will be the barometer of returning prosperity, and that there are already portents of a business awakening. He is opposed to any in-

crease of federal taxes and favors instead an increase in the bond indebtedness.

"I feel that nothing would suppress a business revival as quickly as a tax boost," he said.

Restoration of confidence to capital was also urged, so it would feel safe to make investments, and build and hire, and thus deplete the ranks of the unemployed.

Congressman Hawley is also scheduled to visit Ashland today, where he will make an address.
