

ENROLL NOW FOR ASHLAND NORMAL EVENING CLASSES

SOUTHERN OREGON STATE NORMAL SCHOOL, Sept. 23.—(Special) —Schedule for night classes at the Southern Oregon State Normal school will be made out the last of the week and those planning to attend are requested to write or call the Normal school immediately as the courses to be offered will depend on the requests from those who expect to enroll.

Many inquiries are coming in daily and the enrollment for the night work will probably be large, it is indicated.

This is the first time that work of this type has been offered in southern Oregon and many who are regular attendees are planning to gain credit by this means.

Credit which is earned at the night classes will be accepted as normal school or junior college work and will be equivalent to a course taken in the daytime.

Courses will probably be offered in English, history and geography, depending on the requests.

Enrollment for the fall term of the Normal school is climbing steadily and from all indications may be larger even than last year, it is believed.

Students have been coming in during the past two weeks from all over the state to arrange their schedules with President Churchill.

Junior college work, which is offered at the normal school, is drawing many students who are unable to attend their first or second year at the college or university and who can obtain the same work at the Normal school.

Books are now being reserved at the book exchange conducted for the benefit of the student loan fund of the school and any who desire books are urged to come to the office immediately as the supply is limited.
