OLD STAGE ROAD PLACE HAS FIELD OF 50,000 ROSES

For centuries poets have sung of the rosebud. Oscar Wilde, imprisoned, found in its dewy chalice sympathy and beauty. Painters have immortalized a "bowl of roses"—but few artists have let their imaginations take sufficient flight to visualize a field of them. But laymen passing down the Taylor road a few miles northwest of Medford, each day breathe the fragrance from the blossoms of 50,000 rose bushes.

The three-acre field running from the mountain which marks the Old Stage road is dotted with the color scheme of 100 varieties. Red roses, yellow roses, white roses, pink, deep crimsons and sunburst shades lift their blossoms to the early autumnal breeze, which takes from them a wealth of perfume.

Row upon row of roses extend from the road to the end of the track. The thorns of their branches interlock across the small paths ways to evade the intruder. But they are always cut away and when late fall comes, C. T. Lester, manager of this branch of the Villa Nurseries, says the roses will be removed, sold and shipped away.

They were planted on the Taylor road in the spring. Since then they have never been sprayed; cultivation and irrigation have constituted their only care. Their present location is ideal, not far away from the H. D. McCaskey home, where southern Oregon's most beautiful roses are grown.

The field affords a clear view of the Table Rocks in the north, Rocky Ann and Mt. Pitt in the east, the Siskiyou in the south and in the west the mountains of which it is almost a part.

Among the most choice roses grown are the Claudius, Georgus and Angelo Permet, representing pink, yellow and a glorious combination of the two. The President Hoover, Doris Taylor,
