

REAWAKENING FOR JACKSON DEMS IN MEET WEDNESDAY

The democratic party of Jackson county, which has been dormant on the vine for well into four years, has awakened, and will hold a meeting in the Hotel Holland tomorrow night at eight o'clock, to adopt a constitution and by-laws, and consider plans for the coming campaign. The meeting is called by Frank DeSouza, chairman of the county central committee. Everybody with any democratic blood in his veins is urged to attend, especially the women, as they were urged by Nellie Taylor Ross on her recent visit here.

Attorney DeSouza said he wanted every precinct in the county represented, and that it was proposed to put a full ticket in the field, from constable to the White House. He alleged great optimism over the outcome.

The call to arms has enthused such eminent local Bourbon war horses as Lewis Ulrich, Frank Wortman and Moses Barkdull, who declares that "if we can't win this time we won't see a democrat for 400 years." The other two and the Canon wing—Judge and Verne—are not so pessimistic about the future.

The democrats will have a slogan, and thought "Prosperity Without Beans" was a dandy, until it was discovered that it sounded too much like the Wilsonian "Peace Without Victory."

The democrats will have a complete county ticket, and already there are mutterings about candidates, and George Schermerhorn has been mentioned for sheriff, and Judge Canon as justice of the peace against Glenn O. Taylor, incumbent. George A. Codding, incumbent also, is favored for district attorney, and they would like to secure up a good man for commissioner and the legislature. Frank Wortman is mentioned for the former, and Wilbur Ashpole for the latter. Mr. Ashpole once declared he would run for the legislature, if forced to, but would not attend if elected, which makes him a strong candidate.

The party of Jefferson, Cleveland and Wilson, shy at the county judgeship, the treasurer, and assessor job, as they feel that though republicans, the present holders of the positions are competent and unconquerable at the polls.

As it is six months before the political hub is supposed to commence, the Jackson county democracy does not propose to be caught napping.

BEER PEDDLER GETS 30 DAYS

One beer bootlegging case, an automobile front seat violation and a drunk case occupied the attention of the city and justice of peace court today.

James Peterson, who had been under surveillance by the local police for a month on the suspicion that he was operating a beer garden and peddling beer, was sentenced to 30 days in jail on a possession charge, following his arrest last night by police and deputy sheriffs, who broke into his quarters at Talent court on South Central ave. with a search warrant. They discovered there 8 bottles of beer, 20 gallons of beer mash, 150 empty bottles and a capper and supply of caps.

M. S. Hogan was fined \$15 for being boisterously drunk at a rooming house last night.

Howard Spaulding, 19, high school youth, was fined \$10 for having over three adults in the front seat of his car last night about midnight. Judge Taylor then suspended the sentence on certain conditions and revoked his driver's license for 30 days.

ROADS AND RELIEF TALKED BY COURT

County court in regular session today spent the morning discussing road improvement, emergency relief work, heard pleas for aid, and transacted routine business, including approval of mid-month bills.

Frank Applegate, of the local Carpenters' Union called and discussed court house construction wages. It was explained to Applegate that the 40 cents per hour for common labor and the 62½ cents per hour for skilled labor was the minimum that the contractors could pay, and any amount above that sum was discretionary with the contractors, but they could go no lower. This step was taken by the county court to thwart any cutting down of the pay to a \$2 per day scale, or lower.

The wage for state highway relief work has not been fixed, and will not be until the next meeting of the governor's committee the end of the month.

BELLVIEW SCHOOL BUDGET ADOPTED

BELLVIEW, Ore., Oct. 21.—(Spl.)—The budget meeting held at the school house Monday evening was presided over by Mrs. Susanne Homes Carter, county superintendent, who explained very carefully all points about the budget, and about the 6 per cent tax limitation, showing that it is necessary for the voters to vote for any taxation that exceeds 6 per cent. The vote to exceed the 6 per cent limitation passed with a good majority. The budget, as planned by the school board, received 32 favorable votes and 18 negative.
