

MEDFORD READY INVADE PELICANS ROOST SATURDAY

Shreve, Sheel and Walker Nursing Bruises—Klamath Carrying Load of Confidence—Star Injured

The Medford high school football squad, with three of its leading players, Shreve, Sheel, and Walker nursing bruises, last night completed its hard work for the game Saturday with Klamath Falls, at Klamath Falls, which will probably decide the southern Oregon conference championship for this season.

Elliot, star fullback of the Klamath team, will be out of the game with a broken finger, sustained in the Ashland game. His place will be taken by Tabor, a reserve with little experience, but big and fast.

Have Confidence
The Pelicans are top-heavy with confidence, though they have won but one game from Medford in many years of competition. Coach Avritt has "pepped" up his proteges, and as a climax to week of drilling, the Klamath Falls papers announce that the squad "will have breakfast and lunch at the Pelican Grille, so they can spend a morning with the coach."

Sigford, running guard of the Pelicans, is touted as the leading high school linesman of state high school players, and is expected to do his stuff against the Burghermeisters.

Probable Lineup
The line-up of the Medford team at the starting whistle will probably be:

Cave, center; Glem and Orlove, guards; Cunningham and White, tackles; Shreve and Bennett, ends, Harrington, quarter; Zumburn and Sheel, halfbacks, and Pichtner, fullback.

The second team will be taken to Klamath Falls, with an early start. Saturday afternoon, at Van Scoyoc Field, the Medford Juniors will play Grants Pass. The Grants Pass team has defeated Ashland and Roseburg, and is a strong contender for the Junior honors.

Ashland and Grants Pass, both defeated by Klamath Falls, will meet in a conference game.

LILLARD HAS HOPE MAY PLAY AGAIN

CORVALLIS, Oct. 23.—(AP)—Tonight's scheduled Oregon State College-Oregon Normal school football game has been postponed to Saturday afternoon on account of continued rain and stormy weather.

Signs of Better Times

NEW YORK, Oct. 23.—(AP)—More cheerful news for the farmer is found in a tabulation showing that the value of leading farm products—wheat, cotton and corn, has increased some \$370,000,500 in the past two weeks by the upward swing of the futures markets.
Figures based on current quoted prices indicate an increase since October 5 in the value of wheat of \$100,691,000, of cotton \$151,694,000 and of corn \$147,715,500.
Consideration is given to the government's latest estimate of the current crop. In estimating the increased valuation of cotton, also in the carryover from last season. Wheat estimates also include the current drop and carryover.

The kidnapers were Marcus Blumenthal, alias Jack Markham; Albert Sileo, alias John Rocco; Theodore Adanoff, alias Harry King, the latter two both from Newark, N. J., and Nicholas Rutigliano.
A mulatto girl, known as Betty Green, was tried with the kidnapers, but was acquitted.

ALBANY, N. Y., Oct. 23.—(AP) The court of appeals today affirmed the death sentence of Rudolph Durlinger, New York pal of Francis "Two Gun" Crowley. Durlinger was convicted of the murder of Virginia Joyce Branigan, dance hall hostess. Crowley also is under a death sentence for killing a policeman.
