

CANADIAN BUTTER FRIGHTENS TRADE

PORTLAND, Oct. 23.—(AP)—Increasing offers of Canadian butter in the eastern and midwest trade have resulted in almost general easiness in the entire American industry. Altho the local market appears more or less steady there was an undercurrent of uncertainty in the trade, says the Journal today.

Almost general declines in the price of eggs were reflected in most of the leading markets of the country during the day.

Demand is improved all through the market for live chickens with receipts somewhat curtailed as a result of the great spread between Portland and California prices.
