

BOOTLEGGERS OF OAKLAND PAYING OFFICERS GRAFT

More Than 150 Policemen Suspected by District Attorney—Large Sum Collected Monthly, Is Claim

OAKLAND, Cal., Oct. 23.—(AP)—District Attorney Earl Warren disclosed today he had obtained evidence which probably would result in the dismissal of more than 150 Oakland policemen suspected of accepting large sums of money as bribes from bootleggers.

Warren said the evidence indicated 200 to 250 protected bootleggers in Oakland had been paying policemen \$40,000 to \$50,000 a month for about four years and that aggregate amount of their payoffs thus far amount to as much as \$3,000,000.

Sold Seized Liquor
Besides figuring in a monthly "payoff" Warren said the evidence indicated the suspected officers, including both uniformed and special detail men, had formed a "ring" to sell seized liquor to certain speak-easies at double the prevailing wholesale price.

Speakeasies paid \$125 to \$200 a month for protection, Warren said. Depending upon their location and volume of business, he asserted the evidence showed the liquor dispensers recently had balked at police demands for a larger "payoff" and had formed a "protective association."

Made \$20,000 Year
The district attorney said bank accounts, records of property transfer and income tax returns had been scrutinized by county and federal officials in gathering evidence against the policemen. One officer, he said, had bank deposits of \$20,000 for one year although his salary was only \$280 a month.

The prosecutor said the evidence probably would be presented to a county grand jury.

OVERPRODUCTION IN AGRICULTURE BROUGHT SLUMP

Secretary Hyde Says Prevailing Conditions Result of Ten Years' Unlimited Exploitation of the Soil

NEW YORK, Oct. 23.—(AP)—Secretary of Agriculture Arthur M. Hyde said today that the present business and industrial condition was the direct result of the agricultural depression of the past 10 years.

The secretary was a speaker at the eighth conference of major industries, held at Columbia university. "There is no longer any debate as to the cause of the agricultural collapse," said Secretary Hyde. "There are many contradictory causes, but the one cause which stands out above all is overproduction. One year of overproduction is not in itself fatal but ten years is more than any industry can stand."

Science Needed
The principal factor in agricultural over-production is the uneconomic use of land, Secretary Hyde said. "The present policy of unplanned agriculture must be replaced by a policy of scientific utilization of our land, providing for its protection against erosion and limiting our agricultural plant to such size as will supply our national needs without the blight of over-production," he said. "What agriculture now needs is not more wheat lands but more forests, more game preserves, more airports, more and larger golf courses, and more city farmers with larger estates and smaller production."

Auto Export Plan
Andre Citroen, French auto magnate, suggested that automobile manufacturers in the United States, Belgium, England, France, Germany, Italy, and Czechoslovakia form an "international automobile exporting corporation" which would have the exclusive right to sell automobiles in 107 other countries where there are no manufacturers of automobiles. Such a corporation, he said, should negotiate with the governments involved to bring about complete suppression of customs barriers, since they have no motor car industry to protect.

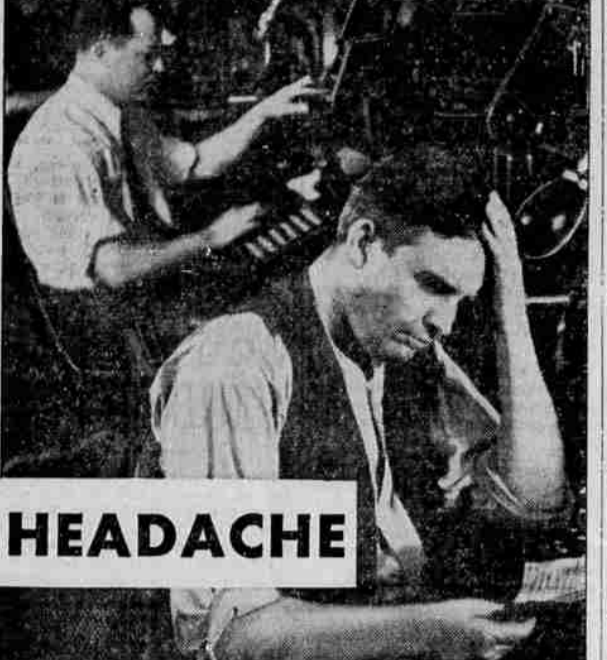
Land Gyro in K. F.

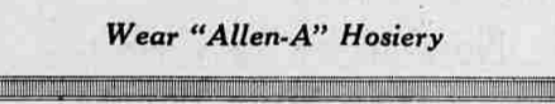
