EASTER SERVICES TO MARK PASSING OF LENTEN DAYS

Devotions Will Be Featured By Special Music Programs—Sunrise Service for Young Near Phoenix

"He Is Risen" is the joyful theme that will ring in the souls of millions the world over this morning, as they go forth to thousands of churches to worship the Christ.

The many devotions planned in Medford and Rogue River valley this Easter morning, however, are not confined to services in the churches. At 6:15 today the young people of the valley will gather at Rader hill near Phoenix for a sunrise service, with the main address to be given by Dr. Walter L. Van Nuys.

Special services are being held by many denominations, and the Methodist Episcopal church, South, will have baptism of infants and the reception of children. A program of music is to be presented in the evening.

The Wright California players will present the Easter drama, "In the Shadow of the Cross," at the Baptist church in place of the regular service.

A concert of sacred selections with the Easter theme predominating will be presented at the Presbyterian church under the direction of evening gathering. Dr. Walter Van Nuys of Portland will speak at the morning worship.
