

SPEARS QUITTING AS OREGON COACH FOR BADGER POST

Wisconsin Contract Calls for \$10,000 Year, Is Report—Successor at Oregon Will Be Named Soon

MADISON, Wis., March 30.—(AP)—Dr. Clarence Spears, football mentor at the University of Oregon, has accepted the position of head football coach at the University of Wisconsin, the board of regents announced today.



Dr. Clarence Spears board of regents did not announce the new coach's salary, but it was reported on good authority that it was \$10,000 for a year's contract.

Weeks of negotiations preceded Spears' decision to take the position. In selecting Spears, the board of regents acceded to the demands of a coach with a "national reputation."

EUGENE, Ore., March 30.—(AP)—Hugh Rosson, graduate manager of University of Oregon, announced today that Oregon will proceed immediately to select a football coach to succeed Dr. Clarence W. Spears, who has resigned to take the coaching job at University of Wisconsin.

Sudden Decision "Dr. Spears' decision to leave Oregon came suddenly, with the meeting in Portland Tuesday night. It came after we thought he would stay and, of course, we have not yet begun negotiations for a new coach."

Had Denied Resignation Spears' resignation followed repeated assertions that he had decided to remain at Oregon, and frequent denials that he was to accept the Wisconsin offer.
