gaping treasury deficit. It is directed at enactment of the revenue raising bill, a slash in appropriations and government reorganization.

The tax bill gets first call. Returning from the White House today Chairman Smoot of the finance committee declared for hearings on the bill beginning probably next Wednesday.

He agreed with Mills that the 1933 budget will not quite be balanced on the basis of the revenue measure passed yesterday by the house but he had no suggestion for new taxes.

Secretary Mills and treasury experts will be the first heard by the finance committee. There is talk of an effort to revive the sales tax in the senate, but Watson of Indiana, republican leader, predicted little success for the move.

Because of administration contentions that the house measure will not balance the budget, new fields of taxation probably will be explored in the senate but there is no
