TAX COLLECTIONS SHOW PROSPERITY OVER LAST YEAR

A Jackson county barometer of return to normalcy and more settled economic conditions is provided by the tax department of the sheriff's office. On April 1, last year, the tax collection department had issued its 1000th tax receipt. On the same date this year more than 1300 tax receipts had been issued. For the past three weeks there has been a fairly steady run of tax payments by citizens.

Secretary of the Treasury Rufus Holman last week issued a statement showing that tax delinquency in Jackson county had decreased 10.74 per cent since January 1.

Tax payments this year will be in excess of last year by a substantial margin, the tax collection department declares. More of the payments than usual are for the full year.

The first half tax payment period ends in May. Corporation half year tax payments are due the last of this month.

HUNT FOR BODIES UNAVAILING NEAR MOUNTAIN CABIN

Search for the bodies of Edwin C. Brown and wife, Dead Indian district homesteaders, who lost their lives in a blizzard last January, while attempting to reach their cabin, was renewed this week with the coming of settled weather without success, or new clues.

William Lindsay, friend and neighbor of the Browns, and J. McMahon, who have been leading the grim hunt, came to Ashland today for provisions, and will continue the search.

They doubt if the frozen snowshoe tracks found in the vicinity of the Brown cabin, were made by the unfortunate couple, but are inclined to believe they were the imprints of searchers, who visited the district, shortly after disappearance of the Browns was known. A thorough search in the neighborhood of the cabin has been futile.

The snow is melting slowly but steadily. The searchers are anxious to find the bodies, lest they become the prey of wild animals.
