## SALEM STUDENTS FACE PROSECUTION FOR BEATING BOY

SALEM, Ore., April 21.—(AP)—Assault complaints and expulsions from school loom for the 10 high school athletes who Tuesday afternoon abducted and beat Victor De Jardin to unconsciousness. It was indicated here today. Legal steps to be taken by the parents of the victim will be decided following a conference with the district attorney's office today.

De Jardin was found badly beaten several miles from Salem, where he was taken by 10 students, allegedly members of the "Julius Caesars" secret society. The attack on him was said to have been made because of his refusal to join the "fraternity," which has been banned with other secret societies by school authorities.

As a result of the injuries the victim will be unable to attend school for some time, his mother announced last night. He was reported to be suffering from injuries from kicks in his side and from head injuries. Reports the attackers had also choked the lad were confirmed by Mrs. De Jardin.

The father and mother are investigating the affair themselves while school officials began a thorough probe. The matter will be taken up by the school board next week.

Principal Fred D. Wolf of the Salem high school issued an ultimatum yesterday that the boys participating in the attack would be expelled from school.

The Grange will also entertain Saturday night with a dance at the Phoenix Grange hall.



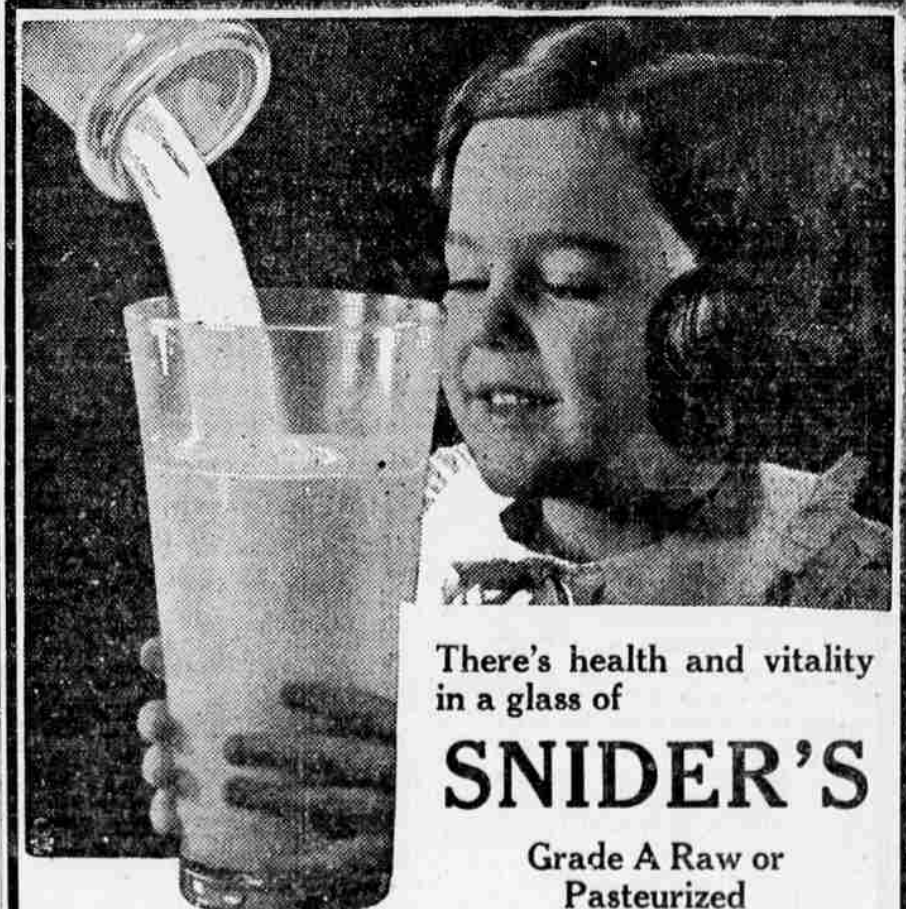
