Consideration was given pre-natal and maternal care, the pre-school child, the school child, education and training of the family in health education, vocational guidance and child labor, recreation, religious education and the handicapped child.

Miss Carlton addressed all the county health organizations of the state, choosing as her subject, "How Volunteer Agencies Can Assist in Child Health Programs."
