REPORT ON SCHOOL BUILDING PROGRAM, MEDFORD SCHOOLS. With final adjustments on the last of the minor contracts in connection with the school building program reported complete, the School Board at its meeting Tuesday evening gave a statement of progress on the general building program to be made covering work done to date, together with receipts and disbursements for the building operations. The statement follows: On January 15, 1931, the people of Medford by a vote of 685 to 58 authorized a school building program involving four separate projects at a total estimated cost of \$330,000.00. The projects ordered constructed were as follows: 1. A new high school on South Oakdale avenue. 2. A new Washington school on South Peach street. 3. An addition to the Roosevelt school. 4. An addition to the present Junior High school on Second street. The funds necessary to carry out the program were to be derived as follows: 1. A bond issue of \$265,000.00 which was passed at the same time the building program was voted. 2. From the sale, salvage, and use of two old buildings and the unused sites owned by the School District. To date the building program has not been completed. The old junior high site, valued at \$40,000.00, has not been sold and the new junior high school addition, which is estimated to cost about \$20,000.00, has not been built. With the exception of this, the program voted by the people has been completed. As the time the program was voted there were some prospects of a quick sale of the site. Since that time there has been little opportunity for a favorable sale. With the present depressed values the board has felt it would be unwise to attempt to throw it on the market, until times are better, and has accordingly held up the completion of the last named project. Lots 4, 5, 6, 7, Block 60, to Nazarene Church 1,013.50 Other assets (old site, salvage material on hands, etc.): Old Junior High site on North Bartlett, estimated value \$40,000.00 135,000 unused brick in storage at \$150.00 per M 3,725.00 Balance due on lots purchased by Nazarene Church 991.89 The amounts applied to each project for building operations by the board and architect at the time the plans and estimates were made were as follows: High School building \$215,000.00 New Washington school 75,000.00 Roosevelt addition 20,000.00 Junior High addition 20,000.00 Total \$330,000.00 The actual costs of each building project except the Junior High addition, which has not been started, are given below. A detailed itemization of all costs under each contract or project are on file in the office of the district clerk. They involve many hundreds of separate entries and are rather voluminous to publish but are available for examination to anyone interested.

Each building project was, so far as possible, broken up into a number of small contracts instead of letting it in one, two, or three large contracts as is sometimes done. There were several reasons for this: 1. It saved the district some of the general contractor's profits on the minor contracts. 2. It divided the work into smaller jobs and made it possible for more contractors, and especially the smaller contractors, to bid on the work. 3. It enabled the board to keep a closer control on the letting of work and to be more sure that the work would be let to Medford men and Medford firms.

Contractable of the work was done by day labor for the same reasons. About 94 per cent of all money spent for labor in all building operations went to men living inside the school district. Practically all contracts, with the exception of the electric wiring at the high school, went to Medford concerns and in so far as possible locally produced materials were used.
