

JAP MILITARISTS ISSUE ULTIMATUM TO PARTY CHIEFS

of the army general staff, visited former War Minister General Sadao Araki and informed him that the army would refuse to receive any officers as war minister in the new cabinet if it were formed on party lines.

The crisis confronting the country, he said, demanded that politics be left aside and a "truly national" government be set up.

The constitution requires that the minister of war be a general and consequently the army is able to prevent the formation of any ministry of which it disapproves.

No Mutiny in Navy.
Reports circulated yesterday that the navy had decided to mutiny proved entirely groundless on the basis of an official check-up. All naval bases were found to be quiet. Admiral Mineo Osumi, minister of the navy in the Inukai cabinet, issued an order declaring "all naval personnel must observe the utmost caution to prevent a disturbance of the public mind."

Army headquarters announced that 11 cadets who surrendered to the military police Sunday night would soon be tried by a court martial and dealt with according to military discipline.

Assassins Unrevealed.
Beyond admitting that the perpetrators of the week-end terrorism were 11 cadets and six naval ensigns, the authorities kept the identities of the young men secret.

The Tokyo, Osaka, Nagoya and Kobe stock exchanges remained closed although the rice and silk markets resumed trading. The price trend was downward.

The police disclosed today that the seventeen arrested as perpetrators of Sunday's outrages were connected with the "blood brotherhood" to which also belonged the slayers of Baron Takuma Dan and former Finance Minister Junnosuke Inouye.

Harry Grandall, pilot of the wrecked ship, was well known in Medford having flown the Medford-Oakland mail plane out of here for over two years, until his transfer about a year ago to San Diego.

According to officials at the local airport, Grandall has been flying for the Pacific Air transport since its organization nearly five years ago.

V. A. Bower of this city, father-in-law of the flier, received a telegram this morning from his daughter, saying that Grandall has passed away at two o'clock this morning.

Besides his widow, Irene, he is survived by two daughters, Ethel, 6, and Yrrah Lee, seven months.

Since Grandall's transfer south, the family has resided at San Diego. Previously they made their home at Oakland. Mrs. Grandall rushed to Burbank when word of the tragedy was sent her.

Seely V. Hall, formerly superintendent of the Medford airport, telegraphed from Burbank today that Mrs. Grandall had requested the Los Angeles Masons to conduct the funeral services. Grandall was a member of the local Masonic order.

Grandall visited in Medford about six months ago, although his run has not been here for some time. John Johnston, Pacific coast transport flier, was formerly relief pilot for this area, flying here numerous times from Oakland.

SAN JOSE, Cal., May 17.—(AP)—Johnny Johnston, killed in an airplane crash at Burbank this morning is the son of Mrs. Sadie L. Johnston of this city. He entered army aviation in 1918 and after the war continued as a daring stunt flier, appearing in a number of motion pictures. He flew the first air mail plane out of San Jose. He joined the Pacific Air transport service in 1928.
