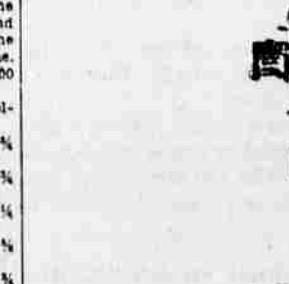
BUSINESS WOMEN CHOOSE OFFICERS
