

### WOMEN INJURED IN JAM TO HEAR TRIAL OF CLERIC

LONDON, May 26.—(AP)—Several young women were injured today while attempting to push their way into Church House, Westminster, where the Rev. H. F. Davidson, 62-year-old rector of Stiffkey, is being tried on charges of immorality.

Inside, spite testimony started yesterday, was continued. It revolved about a photograph of the elderly rector with a young girl who, the prosecution indicated, was nude, except for somewhat insufficient drapery with a shawl.

Repeatedly and heatedly Mr. Davidson denied knowing that, aside from the shawl, the girl was naked. He said he thought she wore a bathing suit, explaining that the picture had been designed to advertise bathing suits. He was bombarded by prosecution questions the general purpose of which was to break down his denial.

### MANN IS EXCUSED TO CLEAR RECORD

PORTLAND, Ore., May 26.—(AP)—John M. Mann, city commissioner for 15 years, was retired from office today by a recall vote.

Mayor George L. Baker, against whom the recall likewise was launched, won his contest. Negligence and inefficiency in office was alleged in each case.

The vote against Mann was 52,829 and for him 28,343. In the case of the mayor, 38,585 persons voted for the recall and 43,882 against it.

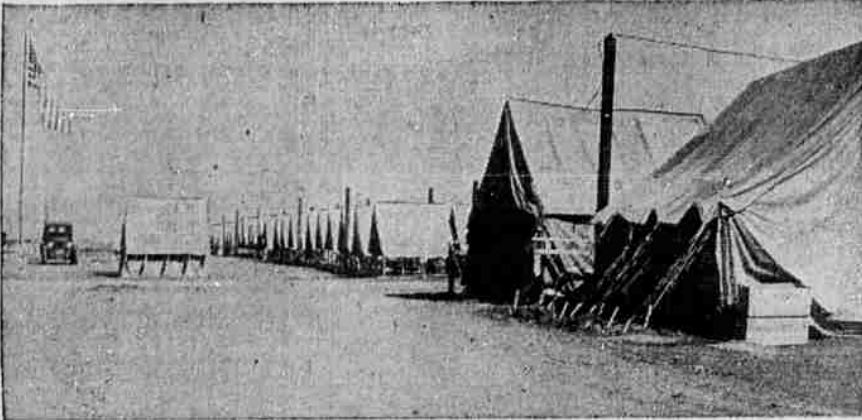
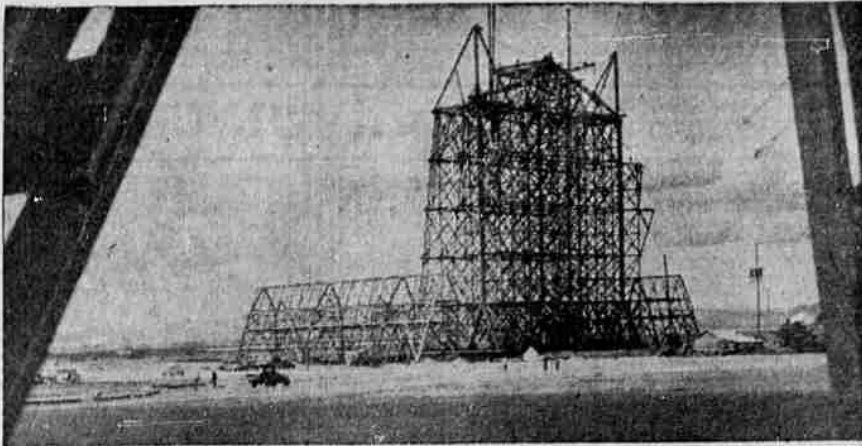
Mann responded to the recall call in the city council meeting today. Before the regular calendar proceedings were taken up, Mann arose and addressed the council, expressing friendship for each member. At the conclusion of Mann's remarks, Mayor Baker said:

"Let the records show that Commissioner Mann has been excused at his own request."
