COPCO FRANCHISE GIVEN DEEP STUDY BY CITY COUNCIL

Medford, May 31.—(AP)—A study of the Copco franchise was given a deep study by the city council today. The study was conducted by a committee of five members, headed by Mayor Clarence Meeker. The committee reported that the franchise was a "very good one" and recommended that the city accept it. The franchise would provide for the installation of a new water supply system, including a dam and a pipeline. The cost of the project is estimated at \$1,000,000. The city council will meet again tomorrow to discuss the report.

MURDER FOLLOWS LONDON SOCIETY COCKTAIL PARTY
LONDON, May 31.—(AP)—A mystery involving high London society circles developed today when Michael Scott Stephen was found shot to death in a flat occupied by Mrs. Elvira Dolores Barney, beautiful daughter of a wealthy knight who four years ago married John Sterling Barney, 31, an American singer.
