The Die Is Cast

THE astounding revelations of Tammy corruption, in the city of New York under Mayor Walker, brought out by Samuel Seabury, promise to become an important issue in the presidential campaign.

If as reported, Mr. Seabury will demand the removal of Mayor Walker, then Governor Franklin Roosevelt will be placed between the devil and the deep blue sea.

If he refuses to act, and should receive the democratic nomination, then he will be forced to carry the Tammany tiger and wise-cracking Jimmy, on his shoulders throughout the campaign.

If he accepts the challenge, and removes the Mayor, then he will lose the support of Tammany at the democratic convention and fail to get the united support of the New York delegation.

Such action we believe is now his only hope of securing the democratic nomination, and winning the election in November.

Who Is Looney Now!

IN LOOKING over our files of three years ago we recently found some comment in this column on the high price of common stocks in relation to earning power.

It is interesting to note today, that the exact reverse is true. At present prices, many stocks are not only paying 8 and 10 percent, but as high as 18 percent.

The relation of present prices to cash and quick assets is even more striking. In the current Forbes magazine 20 stocks are listed for example, whose cash assets—(money and government bonds in the bank)—exceed the market value of the company on the stock exchange, at prevailing quotations.

White Motors is mentioned as a striking example. At its stock value of 7 3/4, this company could be purchased for approximately \$5,000,000. According to its last statement it had \$8,500,000 in cash and government bonds. It had receivables and merchandise worth \$15,000,000. Factories and real estate were worth \$14,000,000 more—a grand total of \$37,500,000. Liabilities in current accounts only totalled \$1,300,000—or a net worth of \$36,200,000.

In other words here is a corporation worth \$36,000,000 which can be bought at the present market price for \$5,000,000. Or to express it in another way, this corporation could buy out all its stockholders, with cash it has in the bank, and still have \$3,500,000 left in cash and government bonds, as a reserve!

AS FORBES magazine states, this business and the others mentioned, are regarded by Wall Street as worth more dead than alive. They could close down now and sell out, and each stockholder who purchased at present quotations would realize a tremendous profit,—in the case of White Motors at least 500 percent! This would be at FORCED sale value.

We can think of no more striking example of how we Americans love to go to extremes—insist upon doing so in fact. From the insane heights of 1929, we have rushed to the even more insane depth of 1932. And nothing is more certain than this (unless the country is going to the dogs entirely, in which case nothing financial matters) namely:

Those who get into the bear market now before it goes up, are going to profit, just as those profited who got out of the bull market before it went down.

We wonder who they will be!

It Cannot Be Quiet. You'll Buy Stocks Again. 100% Tax On Crime. April 5th Won; Wales Danced.

Jeremiah, whose speciality was lamenting, wrote "There is sorrow on the sea; it cannot be quiet." You may substitute "Wall Street" for "sea" and it will still be accurate.

Yesterday morning when "the street" heard that the budget was balanced, stocks went up and all was as gay as the playing of fountains at Versailles.

Then somebody began thinking, and the fountains stopped spouting. The thinker, perhaps, said to himself: "The budget is balanced IF" the budget balancing is done on the assumption that "socking the rich" will yield all that is hoped for.

Also, there are few rich left to be "socked." You could say of New York, lair of the rich, what the same Jeremiah said of another great city.

"Concerning Damascus. Hamath is outcounted and Arpad; for they have heard evil tidings; they are faint-hearted."

Pick out any two of the former "very rich" and they will answer the description of Hamath and Arpad. However, it will pass, and you will be buying stocks, and wondering why you did not buy at the bottom.

New York City may be in some ways like Damascus in the days of Jeremiah, but New York has more money.

Yesterday, Mr. Berry, New York's comptroller, announced that he had collected in one day more than seventy-four million dollars in taxes, more than on the same day in 1931.

To some extent, the misfortunes of property owners stimulate tax paying. A man with a mortgage must pay taxes or have his mortgage foreclosed. Many that would let taxes run dare not do so, on account of the mortgage holder.

The senate, on Tuesday, voted to tax 100 per cent all incomes earned through violations of state or federal laws.

This indicates the opinion that our government is more efficient, collecting taxes, than in stopping crime. And that opinion is sound. We collect; we do not check crime.

With a one hundred per cent tax bootleggers, racketeers, and the army of crooked politicians will have nothing more to do with banks or safe deposits. Even the big tin box at home will not be safe from a vigilant government prying.

One million Britons went to see "April the Fifth," a 100-to-6 outsider, win the derby. Millions were lost on the favorite.

The king, Queen Mary and all their children saw the horses run, and the night before the derby, Mrs. Amelia Earhart Putnam, our Atlantic ocean flier, danced three times with the Prince of Wales at a charity ball. It was an exciting day and night in London.

Senator Carter Glass of Virginia believes he has a better plan than the Goldborough bill for increasing the money supply. He would make all government bonds eligible as a basis for issuing currency, thus increasing the supply of currency in circulation by about a billion dollars. One billion would help, but it is less than ten dollars per inhabitant and the country needs more.

Congress, seeking to make itself popular, rejected a "sales tax." But you will find a good imitation of a sales tax when the new bill goes into effect.

It will cost more for letter postage, income taxes will be increased, and you will pay taxes on cosmetics, jewelry, automobiles, candy, soft drinks. Congress discovered that socking the rich alone would not do, and the poor had to be socked to some extent, including the honest working girl, buying her complexion preparations.

A few of our old subscribers may remember, but for the benefit of new ones who have discovered this column since the first session of the school we had better let the preceptress begin her recital all over:

"I have a little girl aged 4 who is perfectly healthy, yet on the slightest provocation she vomits. The finest pediatricians in the city say it's a habit and nothing else, but they offer no remedy for such a habit."

At this point, in the first session, we broke in on the story to say what we think about pediatricians, which is precious little. On this occasion suffice to remark that the neurotic disposition manifests itself in the readiness with which the parents of the child ran to the specialists. At least that is what it spells to my mind.

"You see, she is a poor eater—little or no appetite, has to be coaxed or persuaded, has to be lured or enticed, or fed by hand. I have tried 'not forcing' but taking her plate away and putting her to bed without food. It doesn't bother her, tho. Breakfast she detests—she'll start gagging at the sight of oatmeal or a cooked egg. I've tried giving her a glass of (an insipid food nostrum) with a raw egg mixed thoroughly with the powder, so she can't taste it—in that way she gets her egg and milk all in one—but she will start at 9 a. m. and sometimes at 10:15 she still hasn't taken it. When this happens I have to threaten her. If that doesn't help I spank her. But she is stubborn. She knows I mean to punish her if she doesn't drink or eat, yet she'll just sit here and wait for me to lose my patience. I expect another baby in September and owing to my condition perhaps I become impatient and angry sooner than I ordinarily would. Yet if I allow her to go without her food she loses her color and seems to get thinner, too. I never have to scold or spank except at mealtimes or just before mealtimes. This affects me disastrously. I get nervous indignation before I've even looked at food.

Is there nothing I can do besides scold, spank or lock in a chest? It will be a terrible example for another baby to have to continue like this."

Muffler Needed

My husband, aged 61, keeps every one in the house awake, he snores so hard. (Mrs. A.)

Answer—Send me a photographic record of his snoring and I can judge which type and what cause it is. In the majority of cases of the death-rattle type it is due to relaxation of the soft palate and the falling of this and the base of the tongue back against the rear wall of the throat. Very good. All you need do is fix the scoundrel so he will not roll onto his back in sleep. He may sleep rather prone, that is, belly down, or in the Sims or left lateral semi-prone position which keeps the soft palate and base of tongue forward by gravity. Better no pillow or only a low one. Moreover one who snores should ALWAYS have cool or cold air to breathe all night and NEVER have heavier covers than comfort demands. (Copyright John F. Dille.)

PORTLAND, Ore., June 2.—(AP)—After each had won a fall, Bob Kruse, Oswego heavyweight, was awarded a decision over Ira Dern, Salt Lake City, on a foul here last night, after five minutes of wild grappling in the final session. Dern landed a hard right cross to Kruse's chin, putting the latter down and out.

Kruse won the first fall with a flying wristlock in 19 minutes. Dern evened matters in 7 minutes, 35 seconds with a flying headlock, after weakening his opponent with stomach smacks and rabbit punches.

Harrington jumped out of the ring and raised Kruse's arm, awarding him the bout on a foul.

BRITISH THWART SOVIET ATTEMPT TO ARM IRELAND

LONDON, June 2.—(AP)—A Russian attempt to land arms in southern Ireland for the Irish republican army, the Daily Express said today, was thwarted by the British navy over the past week-end.

The arms, the paper said, were intended to be used by the republican forces, who were placed under the ban of the government during the previous regime of President Cochrane of the Free State, in the event of a conflict between the Free State and Ulster.

The tramp steamers carrying the arms, it said, were warned by radio of the activity of British warships which set out to head them off at Irish ports and they returned to the foreign ports where they were chartered without being able to land the fighting equipment.

The Irish republican army took on a new lease of life after the election of President Eamon De Valera as president of the Free State.

NEW AIR ROUTE IS INAUGURATED

Two pilots landed their monoplane at Swan Island yesterday for the first scheduled flight of the new Airways service between Walla Walla and Portland. Snow was made at Pasco, Yakima, Goldendale and The Dalles.

Although two planes opened the service in the flight to Portland, only one will make the regular schedule. The westbound plane leaves Walla Walla at 7 a. m. and reaches Portland at 9:45 a. m. Eastbound plane leaves Portland at 4 p. m., arriving at Walla Walla at 6:45 p. m.

known communists are in the city. One Emanuel Levin said the Ex-Servicemen's league claims credit for starting the movement in 30 strategic points. The league is planning a mass demonstration here on June 8.

Glasford has about \$400 to feed the campers, now being fed at a cost of 6 cents a day each. They get two meals. The police superintendent appeared before a senate committee yesterday and asked for a federal appropriation of \$75,000.

A midnight show will be given in a local theatre tonight to raise additional funds.

When funds are exhausted Glasford threatens to evacuate the veterans within 48 hours. As long as food is available they probably will be permitted to remain until congress adjourns. Picked leaders of the veterans are now lobbying in congress for the bonus.
