

BUTTER RECEIPTS SURPRISE MARKET; EGG PRICE HOLDS

PORTLAND, Ore., June 10.—(AP)—Surprising increase in local offerings of butter instead of the loss generally reported by makers and receivers, gave trade a somewhat different slant during the last 24 hours. Locally there was no change in general open market conditions but trade appeared to lack snap generally.

Some improvement in quality of dressed hen turkeys is confirmed. Demand is rather firm up to 16c for tops. There is little call for toms.

Sales of both watermelons and cantaloupes have been increased suddenly as a result of the warm weather. Prices in general are showing no further changes for quality stuff.

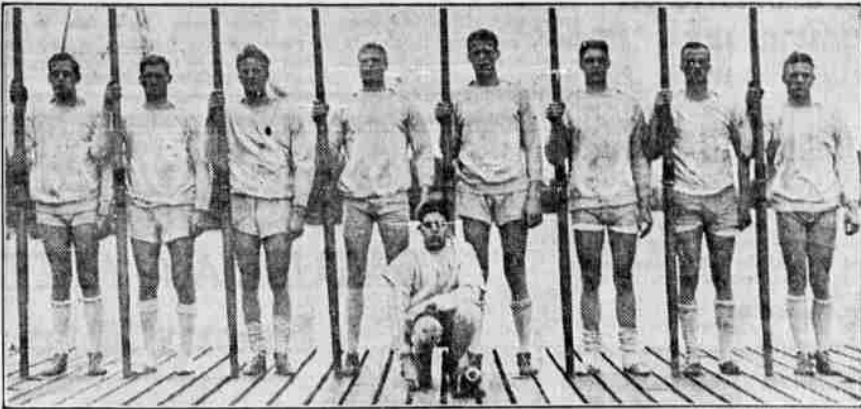

BOLIVIA TIES COIN TO TIN IN TERMS OF BRITISH POUND

LA PAZ, Bolivia.—(AP)—Bolivia is trying to stabilize its monetary unit, the boliviano, by tying it to the price of tin and the British pound sterling. Tin is the staff of national life here, the country producing a fourth of the world's supply.

HOW TO APPLY FOR AUTO TAGS IS MADE PLAIN

Instructions to auto owners, for the securing of 1932-33 auto licenses, due July 1, have been issued by the state police, upon instructions of the secretary of state, as follows: "First, This year you are again to use your registration card as an application for your new plates. The registration card is the little 3x5 form that you now carry in the compartment of your car. Make sure that it is your 1931-1932 card and describes the car you wish to register. The card must be signed on the back in the space provided; and if you have moved to an address other than the one on the face of the receipt, write your present address under your signature."

Prof. Edwin B. Kemmerer of Princeton University stabilized the boliviano at 36.5 cents in 1928, but hard times and an overproduction of tin toppled it. Now, with a new world agreement limiting tin production, the metal brings \$494 a ton, but the cost of production is \$475, so only the richest mines are working. The scheme has a special domestic complication. Mine owners want low exchange so they can get more bolivianos for their tin; business interests want high exchange rates so it will take fewer bolivianos to pay for imports.

The new plates will be available for use upon the highways, on and after June 15, and may be secured as follows: By mail addressed to the secretary of state at Salem, Ore. By applying in person to the sheriff of your county for a temporary permit pending the arrival of the license plate. Captain Lee M. Bown of the southern Oregon district, stressed the following provision: "In event you have misplaced your 1931-1932 registration card, please write the department at Salem IMMEDIATELY upon receipt of this letter for a special registration memo, giving the license plate numbers now on the car you desire to register. Adherence to this rule will avoid a large measure of the inconvenience and confusion of last year, Captain Bown said. 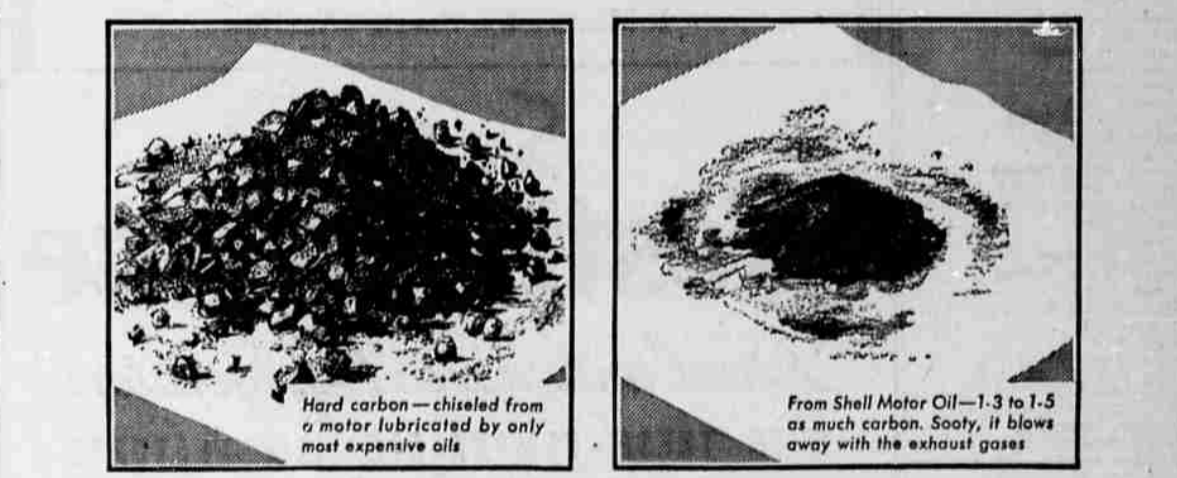
Oregon Friends OK Volstead Act
