

TO TIN IN TERMS FOR AUTO TAGS

the securing of 1932-33 suto licenses, due July 1, have been issued by the state police, upon instructions of the secretary of state, as follows:

Instructions to auto owners, for

Tin is the staff of national life here, the country producing a fourth of the world's supply.

The national control commission has established a sliding scale by which there are 80 bolivianos to the British pound when tin is 80 pounds a ton and 10 bolivianos to the pounds when tin goes up to 180 pounds.

In American money this means that when tin is 8340 a ton the boliviano is worth 17 cents and if the metal goes to \$540 it rises to 25.3 cents.
