

### CLEARING ROUTE IN SAMS VALLEY FOR ROAD GANGS

The work of clearing the right of way for the Sams Valley secondary highway has been started by Jackson county. Seven to ten men are employed and when the construction gets under way this number will be increased to around fifty. Most of the work will be done by residents of the district through which the road passes and who are in need of employment.

The city of Rogue River has inquired what it will cost for the county to oil a strip of road within the corporate limits that is the home of housewives and merchants when the dirt starts flying. The county, in the case of Eagle Point, agreed to furnish the oil equipment, the cost to be borne by the road district.

The county court will leave Sunday to attend the unemployment meet in Portland Monday, called by Governor Meier to discuss ways and means for providing relief. All the county courts of the state will be present.

The petition of 39 residents of the Tillier-Trail district, asking that the state highway commission order a survey of the Jackson county portion of the Tillier-Trail road, will be given consideration. If the survey was ordered the work of clearing the right of way could be started and furnish summer and fall employment.

Douglas county, with federal funds, will spend over \$100,000 on its portion of the road this summer and autumn and will probably complete this year most of the route to the Jackson county boundary line, about 14 miles from Trail.

### WHEAT GROWERS CLAIM DAMAGES

AMARILLO, Tex., June 17.—(AP)—Eight Texas Panhandle wheat growers filed suit in federal district court here today against the Chicago Board of Trade, asking damages of \$48,795 representing losses on wheat sales, an injunction against "pit" operations and long and short selling, and disclosure of the names of eight traders whom they allege control the wheat market.

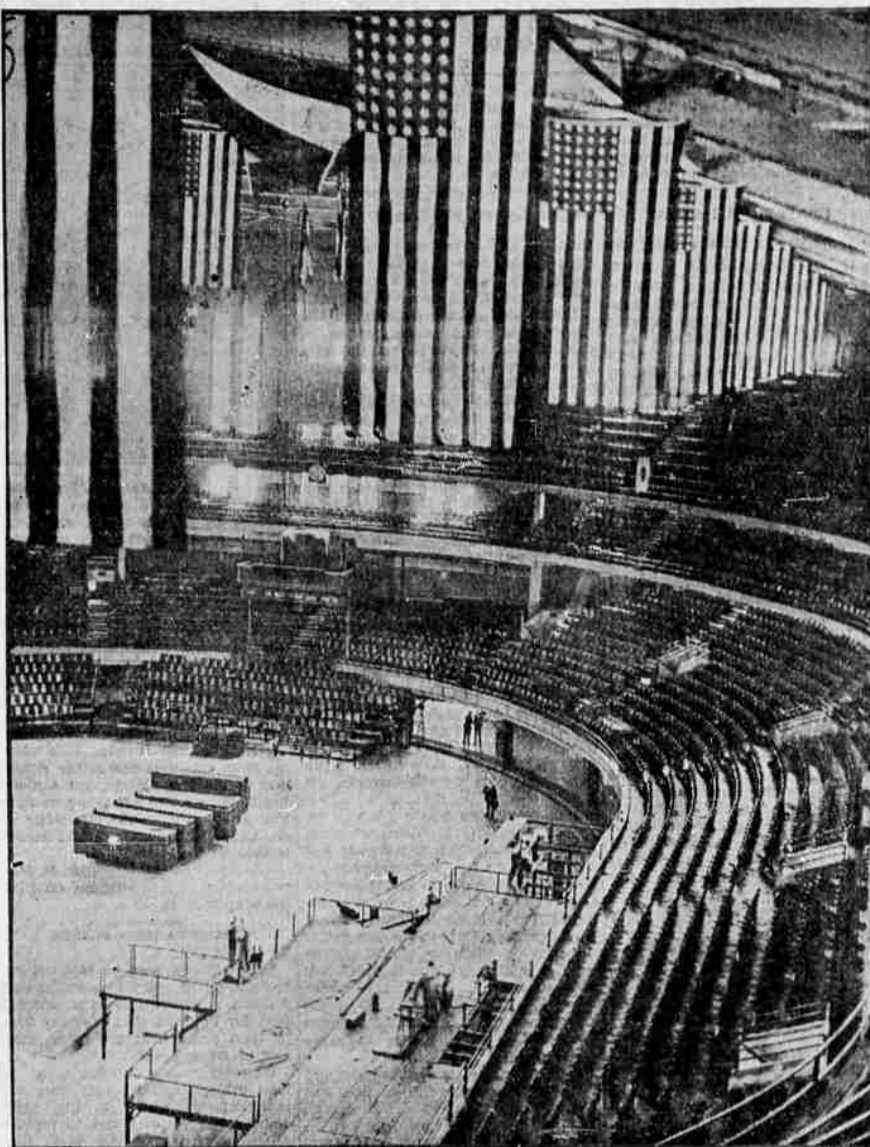
Junior and preliminary events will be held in the morning and finals in the afternoon.

### BRITAIN OFFERS WIPE OUT DEBTS

LUSANNE, Switzerland, June 17.—(AP)—Great Britain offered to wipe the slate clean of reparations and war

debts at the international economic conference here today, but France insisted that elimination of trade barriers was more important than cancellation of the war payments.

Germany's spokesman, in a temperate address, made no reference to repudiation of reparations but indicated that it might be necessary to declare a moratorium on private debts, most of which are owed to Americans.

Against this combined opposition, the Curtis people played an interesting game. At their head was Mrs. Gann herself, presenting constantly at her hotel, in a box at every convention session. She had been at work in fact for months beforehand, making speeches to republican gatherings far and wide, and in every one of them she had praised the achievements of the Hoover administration.

When the Curtis camp found, in Chicago, that it needed the help of the administration, it got it.

States lukewarm toward Curtis, for instance, but undecided where to go, were advised to put up favorite sons, and keep on the sidelines until they saw how events were turning.

It worked very well. When the roll was called, the opposition was widely split, and no one was within gunshot of Curtis. He himself did not quite have the needed majority, but under the circumstances, the big Pennsylvania delegation quickly changed its vote to him.
