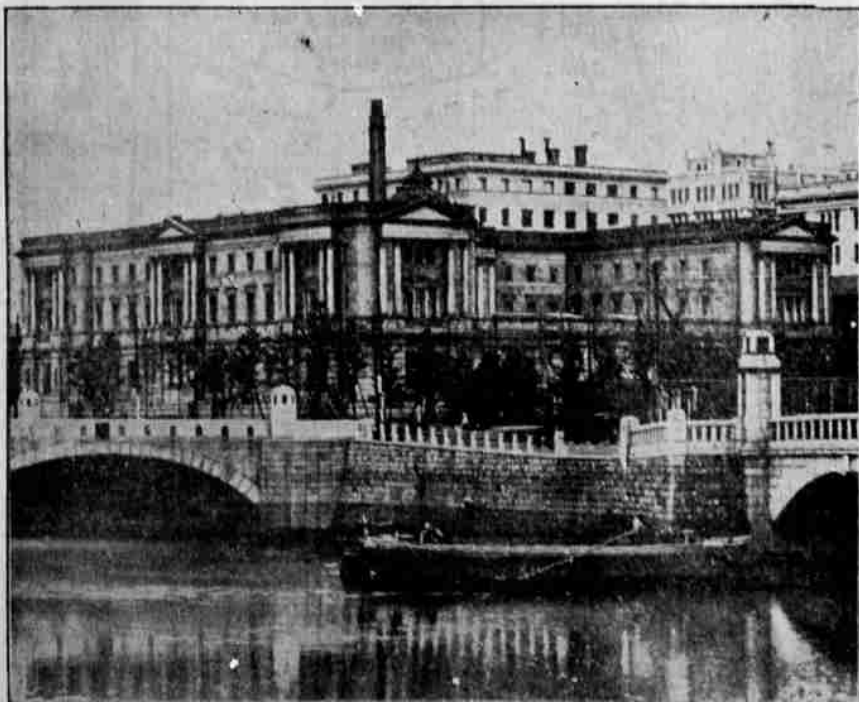

AKRON MAKES COAST TO COAST FLIGHT IN VALIANT STRUGGLE



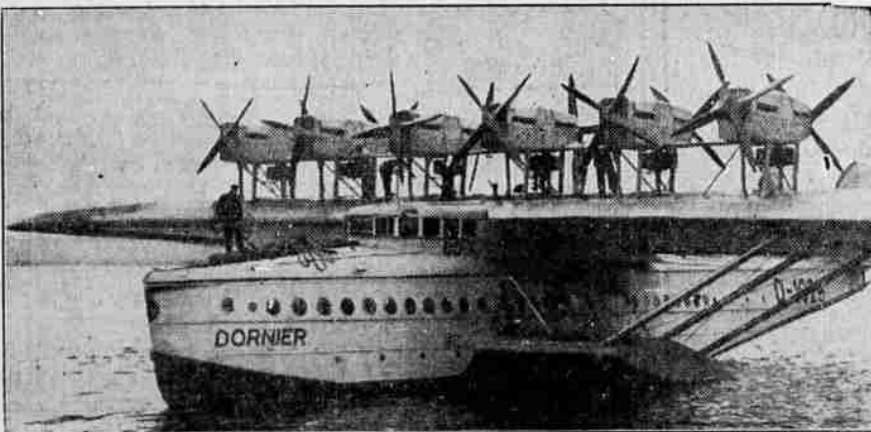

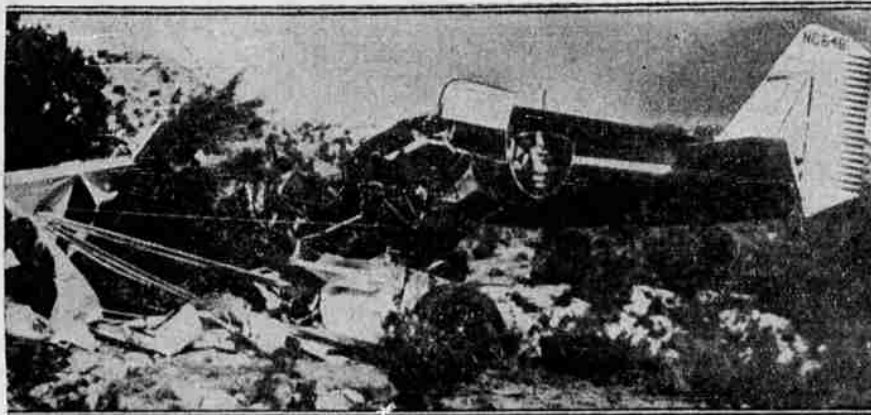

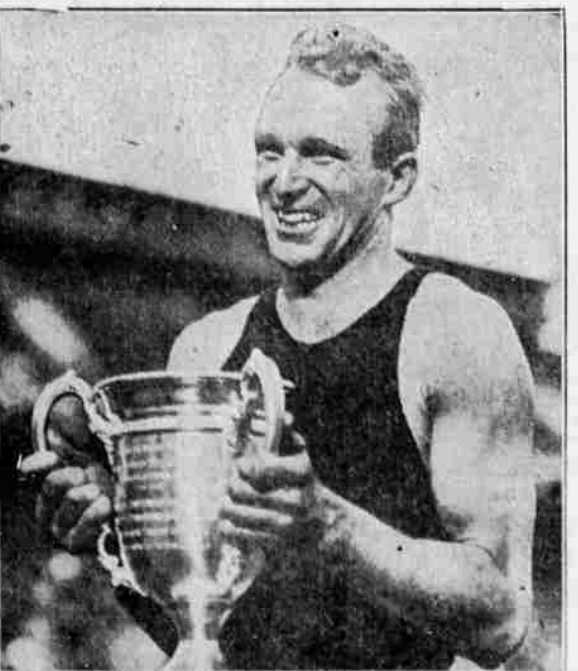
