MATHER MEMORIAL UNVEILED JULY 4

CRATER LAKE NATIONAL PARK, Ore., June 22.—(Sp.)—Honoring the memory of Stephen T. Mather, the first director of the national park service, unveiling ceremonies of the Mather memorial plaque will take place July 4 at the rim of Crater lake. A suitable program is being prepared, with the main address and presentation of the plaque by Judge Robert W. Sawyer of Bend, Ore.

Similar programs are being held on the same day in other national parks where plaques will be placed to perpetuate his memory, in keeping with long and constructive service as park director.

The inscription is as follows: "He laid the foundation of the National Park Service, defining and establishing the policy which its areas shall be developed and conserved unimpaired for future generations. There will never come an end to the good he has done."
