LONDON, Eng., June 24.—(AP)—Former Crown Prince Friedrich Wilhelm of Germany joined his father, the former Kaiser, at Zandvoort, Holland, the Daily Herald said today in a dispatch from Amsterdam.
The former crown prince's visit, the first he has made to Holland in seven years, the paper said, is to attend a conference of former members of the German royal family and monarchist politicians on the possibility of restoring the Hohenzollerns to the German throne.
