## GOLD HILL PLANT RESUMES MAKING CEMENT PRODUCT

The Portland-Beaver Cement company plant at Gold Hill, after a month of idleness, resumed part-time operation July 1. Twenty men are now employed in "grinding," one of the stages of production.

W. H. Murrhead, general manager of the plant, announces that about the middle of the month, he will start filling an order which will take about two weeks time and will use a full force. He said the cement plant would operate "intermittently" thereafter as the market justified. There are signs of a revival of building activity on the Pacific coast. Nothing definite has developed as yet. Its fulfillment would mean increased production and labor at the Gold Hill plant.

There has been an improvement in the lumber industry of the southern Oregon territory the past ten days. Sawmills at Glendale, this city, and Klamath Falls will resume operations this week, or have already started. Lewis Bros. sawmill at Prospect recently secured the contract for cutting 4,000,000 feet of timber on burned over land near Prospect and have started work.

The Owen-Oregon Lumber Sales company of this city started last week under a co-operative plan in the sawmill and will be fully swung this week. The workers have issued an appeal to builders and prospective builders to purchase home produced lumber.

## PERMITS IN JUNE OVER LAST YEAR

Building permits for the month of June, this year, surpass the total for last June, according to figures compiled by Miss Edith Nichols of the city building department.

Fifty new applications were allowed last month, totalling \$750, with 11 alterations amounting to \$2045. In 1931, the four new permits reached a total of \$1100, with ten alterations costing \$1090. These totals show an increase of \$599 for 1932.
