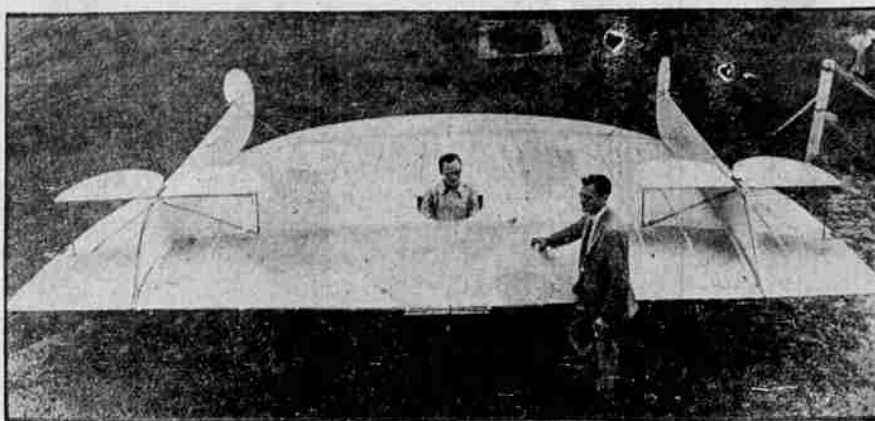


FATHER AND DAUGHTERS DIE IN SUICIDE PACT

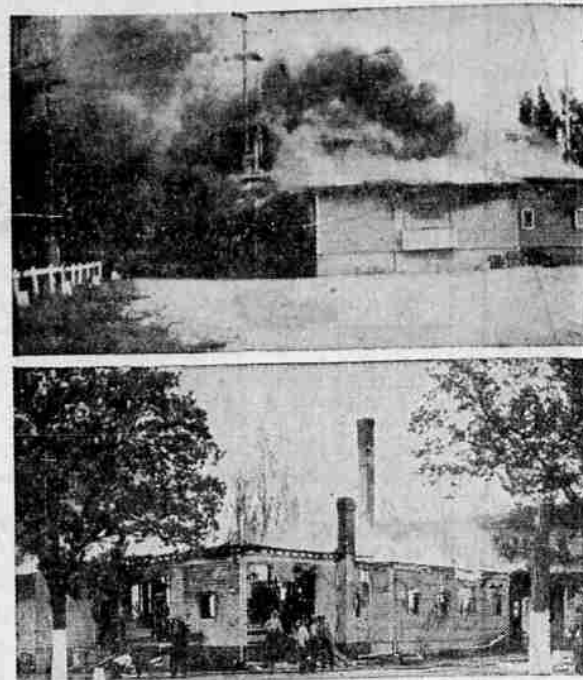

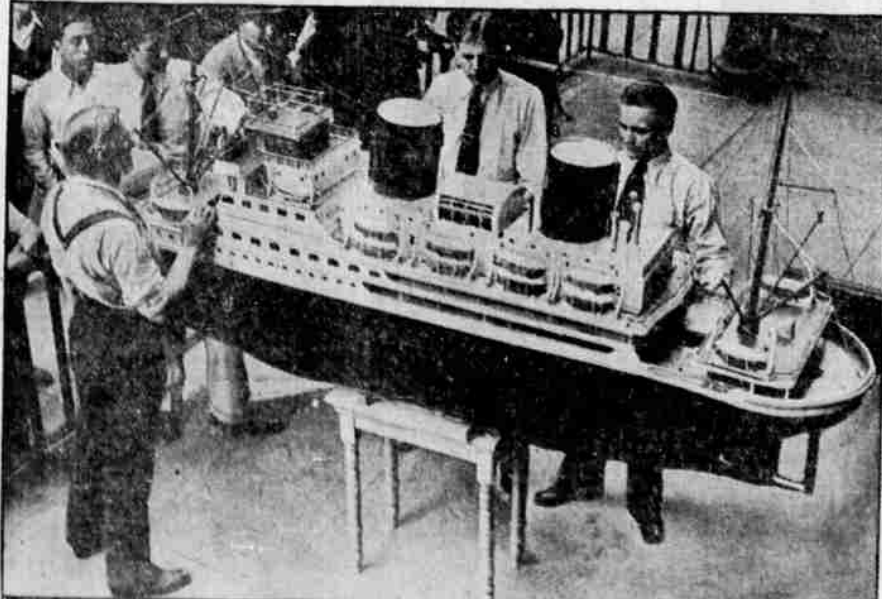

EGAN GIVES UP TO OLD FRIEND ON MURDER CHARGE



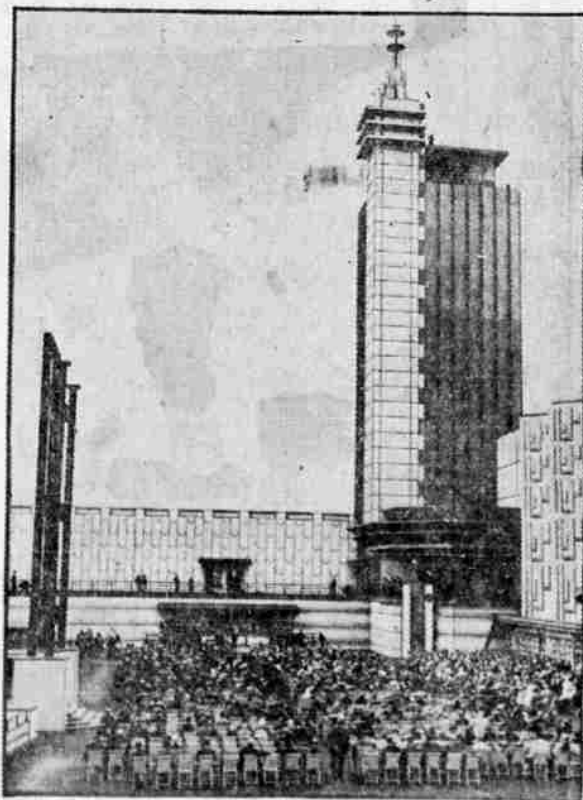
