SALEM, July 12.—(AP)—President Hoover, in a telegram to Governor Julius L. Meier yesterday, said the possible trust feature of a lumber organization is a necessary forerunner to any final organization of a large-scale lumber production combine. The wire was a reply to the governor's appeal to Washington for drastic action to correct existing conditions in the lumber industry.

Prominent lumbermen of Portland plan a conference tomorrow to ascertain if the industry is willing to test its proposed consolidation corporation in federal courts. The Hoover telegram was phoned to Portland by the governor following its receipt here late yesterday.
