MADLINE SLADE CLASSES GANDHI CLOSE TO CHRIST

Daughter of Rear Admiral Reared in Luxury Finds Spiritual Contentment As Follower of Mahatma

Editor's Note: In this exclusive interview, given to James A. Mills, Associated Press staff correspondent in India, Madeline Slade, a daughter of a British admiral and now a disciple of Mahatma Gandhi, tells for the first time why she abandoned her high social position for a place among the humble.

By JAMES A. MILLS. BOMBAY.-(AP)-Mirabal, just freed from the cell where she served three months for her activities in Mahatma Gandhi's civil disobedience campaign, seemed more impenetrable than ever.

Daughter of the late Rear-Admiral Sir, Edmund Slade, commander of British naval forces in East Indian waters, she abandoned her identity as Madeline Slade and her high social place in London and Bombay, to become a humble disciple of Gandhi.

Her reasons have been known in an obvious fragmentary manner, but she always has refused interviews. But now she was ready to talk and this is her story:

"I was reared in luxury and ease. I had a splendid education, traveled widely, danced, had pretty clothes, lovely jewels, many admirers.

"But I lacked spiritual satisfaction and real contentment and I decided that life was an empty sham.

"I found people vain, petty, ambitious, jealous, selfish.

"They sought only their own comfort, happiness and gain. Human and its sufferings and sorrows were secondary to them. They had no ideals.

"I began to seek light. I found it when I met Romain Rolland, the great French philosopher. He advised me, if I wanted to do the utmost good in this world, to join Mr. Gandhi's Ashram (retreat) and Ahimsa, on the banks of the sacred Sarabati river.

WANT BELLICOSE BRITISH ANTHEM

LONDON.-(AP)-Substitution of words of friendship for the bellicose phrasing of the second verse of "God Save the King," the British national anthem, has aroused storms of protest, chiefly in the British Legion.

At a meeting of the Banstead branch of the League of Nations Union a "revised" version of the second verse was sung. The new lines were:

May just and righteous laws, Uphold the public cause, And bless our Isles, The second verse now reads: "Oh, Lord our God arise, Scatter his enemies, And make them fall." A musical authority, explaining the affair, said: "Some time ago it was suggested that words breathing peace might help to promote amity among nations.

ARGENTINE OIL WELL REVEALED BY VOLCANO

MALARQUE, Argentina.-(AP)-The Chilean volcano eruptions seemingly shook an oil field out of the front yard of this west Argentine village.

After the people got the volcano ash out of their eyes, Emilio Mesa noticed a blue haze over outlying fields and found fire smoldering in a hole.

Out of it he dug what appeared to be tar and further investigations show probable petroleum resources in a section hitherto unexplored for oil.
