BrowneLL denied that he had prompted the hoax of a merger bill between the two houses of the legislature, which he said he had introduced.

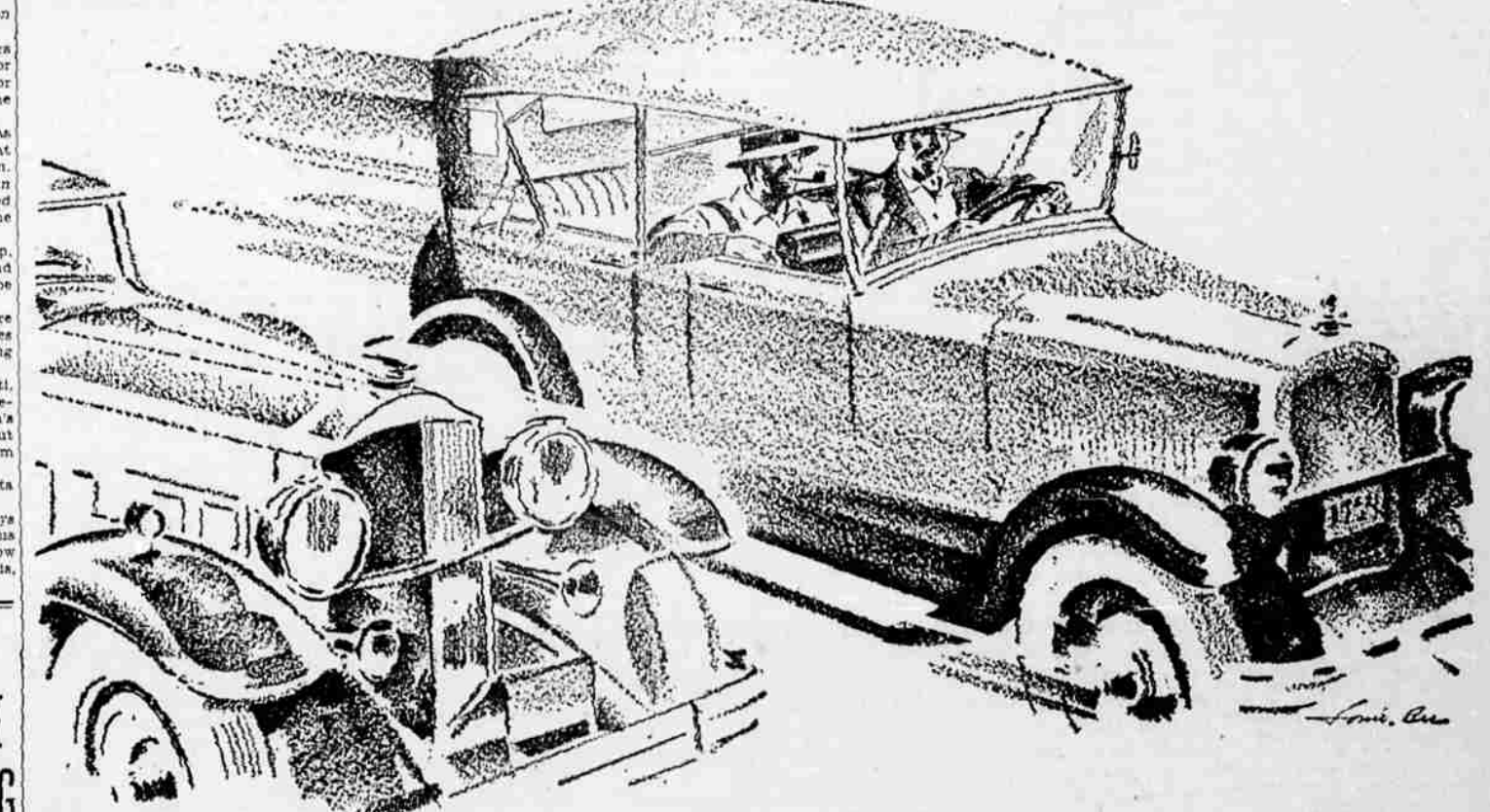
BIRDS USE BOARDS IN NEST BUILDING
