

RIOTS AND TORCH FOLLOW ABORTIVE REVOLT IN SPAIN

Government Plans Punishment for General Jurjo, Leader of Revolutionary Forces—Churches Fired

MADRID, Spain, Aug. 12.—(AP)—Rioting and burning reddened much of southern Spain today as the government laid plans to punish General Jose San Jurjo, leader of Wednesday's abortive rebellion, and his followers.

One man was killed and three wounded at Santa Fe when civil guards dispersed a group which burned the Agrarian casino. One workman was killed in a political fight between laborers and employers.

Guards Watch Churches
A civil guard was killed at Seville when a mob attacked the jail. At Seville, cordons of soldiers were posted around religious houses and heavy guards patrolled the streets.

In the towns of San Lucas and Anacollor, mobs set fire to the churches, but the fires were put out by citizen volunteers.

In Santi Ponce a mob attacked and beat the mayor. He was rescued by a group of town hall guards. A line of guards was stationed around the building of the newspaper Las Provincias at Valencia to protect it from mobs, and General Liqueine rushed from Switzerland by airplane to take charge of a menacing situation.

Convent Burned
Mobs burned a convent at Albacrin and a church at Santo Tomas near Granada.

The death penalty was demanded today by some southern republican leaders for General San Jurjo. Director of Public Safety Mendendez announced a special judge had been designated to preside over the trial.

BONUSERS DUMPED ON K. C. DOORSTEP

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Aug. 12.—(AP)—H. F. McElroy, city manager, said today Kansas City had spent \$1,519,48 in transportation for bonus marchers to Texas, Nebraska, Iowa, Colorado, Utah, California, Oregon, Nevada and Washington.

The city manager charged that St. Louis "summarily shunted" 533 bonus expeditionary force members to Kansas City, only 57 of whom lived here.

GIRL SCOUT CAMP NOT ENDANGERED BY RIVER, REPORT

All precautions are being taken regarding child welfare at Willpen Pines, Girl Scout camp, Dr. C. I. Drummond, county physician, announced today for the benefit of all mothers who have maintained fears of danger from contaminated water in the Applegate river.

Tests are constantly being made of the water, Dr. Drummond stated, and there is no cause for alarm. The bacteria count is very low at the present time, in comparison with tests of other years.

The drinking water is entirely satisfactory, Dr. Drummond said, and the camp operated in a very sanitary manner. There are many girls at the camp this week and they report a jolly time up in the mountain region. Those wishing to register for future weeks of the summer season are asked to call at the First National bank, where registrations will be received.

Funeral services were conducted this week for Everett Stelger of Grants Pass, the son of a prominent Jacksonville pioneer family, following his death Monday from injuries he received in an accident on the Greensprings near Klamath Falls.

Stelger was driving a lumber truck to Klamath when it went off the road and pinned him beneath. A group of forest service men aided his release after he had lain there three hours. He directed the removal of the truck. His death was caused from the injuries. He is survived by his widow and two children, who reside in Grants Pass.
