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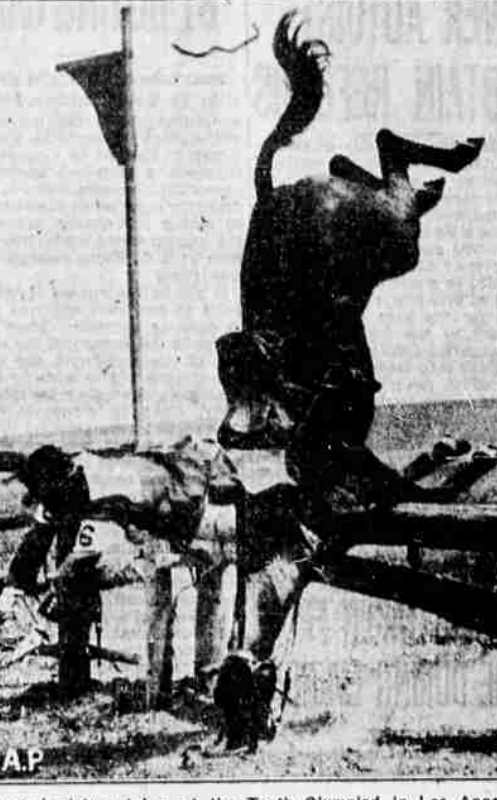
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BITING THE DUST IN PENTATHLON

TRIO OF BAD MEN DOWN FROM HILLS FOR 'VILLE 'BUST'

JACKSONVILLE, Aug. 18.—(Sp.)—Descending on this busy little city amid a cloud of dust, whoods and gunshots, "Greasy John," "Bad Eye Pete" and "Trigger Nelson" took over the place late yesterday afternoon and prepared to rest and "save their ownerness" for the gala Gold Rush Jubilee to be staged here Saturday, August 20.

The three men, whose complete names have long since been forgotten, are the foothills' reputed bad men, always touting guns, knives, red likker and plenty of profanity. During their more passive days they engage in mining up in the hills and burst loose annually for a trip to town to "show them there city slickers something" as they put it. Worried mothers have kept children from the streets since arrival of the trio and Marshal James Little, usually able to cope with any situation, treads softly when the three are about—which is from sundown till dawn—and looks forward to their departure after the celebration.

Knowing habits of the grizzled prospectors, who refuse to shave or bathe, city councilmen are considering ways and means of curtailing their activities and slipping blanks in big black '45's, ere the town be blown off the map Saturday night, when it has always been customary for townsmen with a heavy pouch of dust to split things wide open.

Visitors to Jacksonville this weekend, from 1 p. m. till dawn, are warned to refrain from aggravating the three bad men, lest they be made to dance to the accompaniment of hot lead and hefty guffaws.

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
