

Nandie's Grill, Open Saturday, Provides Smart New Dining Place

ITALIAN, FRENCH DISHES WILL BE MENU FEATURE

Delicious Italian dishes, tasty French morsels and satisfying American lunches and dinners, enjoyed in an atmosphere of old Venice, await southern Oregon people who dine at Nandie's Grill, Medford's new, smart restaurant. Carpenters, electricians, painters and decorators are working at top speed today, putting on the finishing touches in preparation for the opening tomorrow.

Nandie's new Grill reflects the artistry of Medford's decorators and workmen. A touch of old France is added to the Italian atmosphere in harmony with French dishes that will grace Nandie's menu. An entirely new entrance greets the diner who visits Nandie's tomorrow. Modernistic trim adds life to the otherwise severe front while over the graceful center arch the name "Nandie's" is emblazoned in neon.

Upon entering the grill, a long mahogany-topped fountain dominates the front left while pastry and candy counters are at the right. Twelve cozy booths line the walls of Nandie's, fashioned of Philippine mahogany in modernistic design and trimmed in dull gold. Individual little table lamps flood each booth in a soft glow. Indirect lighting, from beauti-

fully designed, hand-wrought lamps give ample light for the main room and three center tables.

An outstanding feature of Nandie's Grill is the mezzanine party room finished in French and Italian shades of green and yellow with black trimmings. Forty people are accommodated in this cozy banquet room which overlooks the main floor. Seven little French windows, screened if desired with Venetian blinds, line the front of this mezzanine room.

Saturday's opening is assuming the aspect of a social event in this city with people from all parts of the Rogue River valley anxious to view F. E. Nandie's beautiful new restaurant. Music will be a feature of the debut of Nandie's Grill tomorrow and delicious foreign and American dishes will be served.

A colorful neon sign, with modernistic trim, will invite hungry diners to Nandie's Grill in the evening while neon window signs will inform the public of Nandie's fountain and pastries.

MEDFORD FIRMS INSTALL NANDIE'S FINE NEW GRILL

In remodeling and equipping his artistic new grill, F. E. Nandie patronized local firms and employed Medford workmen who are completing finishing touches today in preparation for the opening tomorrow morning.

Twelve handsome Philippine mahogany booths with modernistic de-

sign in dull gold were manufactured by the Trowbridge Cabinet Works, which also made the large fountain counter and other attractive fixtures. An archway marked by a Neon sign makes a unique entrance at Nandie's Grill, and guests will see a beautifully arranged interior with a decidedly Venetian atmosphere. No effort has been spared to transform this cafe into one of the outstanding dining places in this part of the state, according to Mr. Nandie.

Tom Swem designed and made the overhead light shades, in addition to small duplicate lamps for the booths. He also had charge of decorating the balcony and the main dining room. Extensive repairs were made in the kitchen, which has been enlarged to afford more space for the retail pastry department.

Patrons of Nandie's will enjoy something different in the way of menus as the new chef will specialize in French and Italian foods, as well as American dishes.
