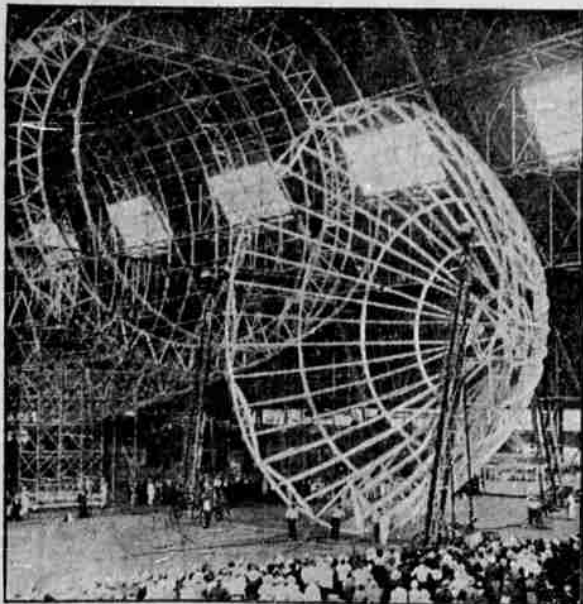


NEW AIRSHIP NEARS COMPLETION

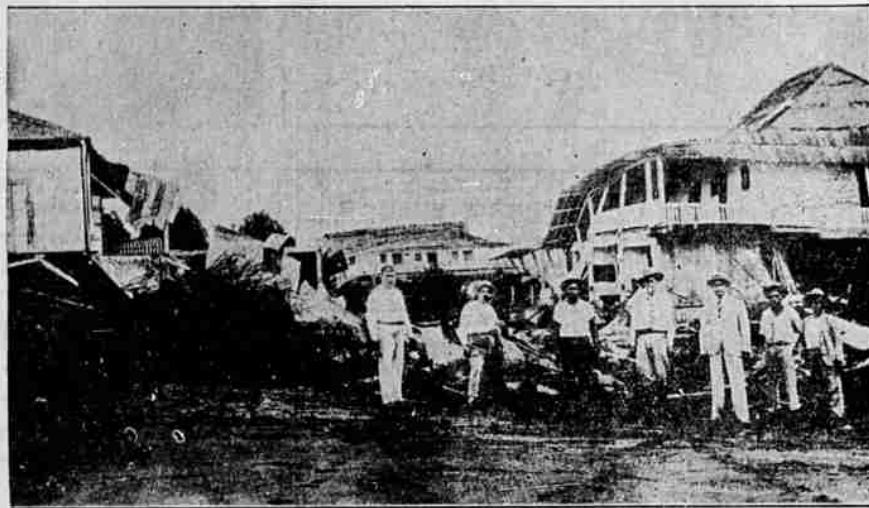

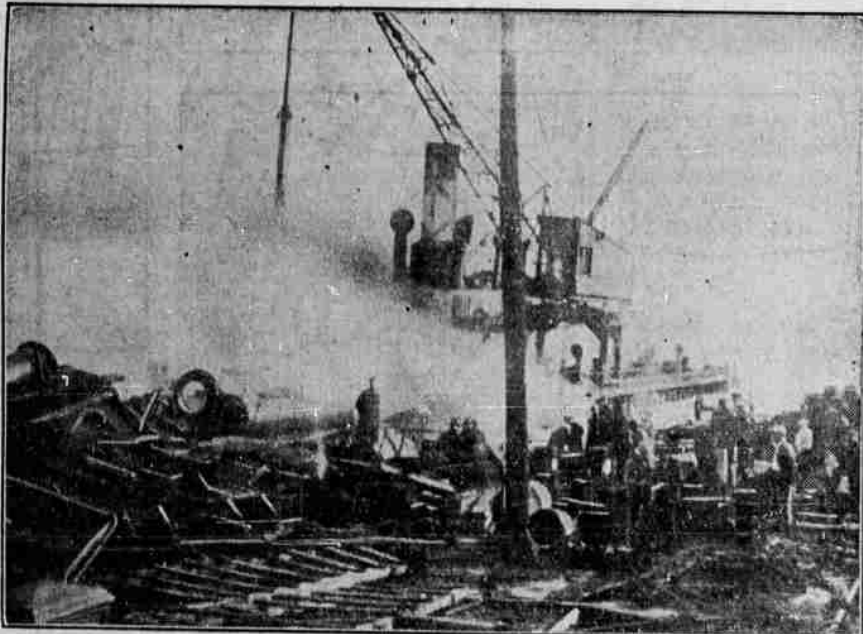

25 BELIEVED DEAD IN MONTREAL SHIP EXPLOSION
