MILD WEATHER IS **AUGUST FEATURE** IN ROGUE VALLEY

Mild weather, characteristic of the summer months of 1932 in the Rogue River valley, prevailed throughout August, according to the meteorolog-J. Hutchison, local meteorologist Except for the first week when temperatures ranged in the higher levels. perseutres ranged in the inglier sweet, and ally averages were mostly below normal. A wide range in temperature was experienced during the month, with extremes approaching August records of previous years. The highest, 107 degrees, on the 4th was but two degrees below the station record of 109 degrees and the lowest tem-
