JACKSON COUNTY COUNTY SCHOOLS RELIEF WORKERS DISCUSS ACTIVITY REPORT INCREASE IN ENROLLMENT

Meeting of Various Groups Reviews Needs - Would Use State Army For Center For Unemployed.

At a called meeting of the Jackson County Unemployed Relief Council Friday afternoon in the county court house, fifty men and women responded "to discuss plans for relief, to prepare for the winter, and to help save the taxpayers' funds" the purpose of the meeting being so stated by County Agent R. G. Fowler, who presided.

The central relief committee consisting of Judge C. B. Lamkin, R. G. Fowler, Mrs. A. E. Reames, C. A. Meeker, Guy Applewhite, Harry Moore, Ben Harder, Victor Tengwald and Jerry Thornton was in power to formulate plans for the county relief work by motion of Mrs. A. E. Reames.

The group also voted to request the central committee to investigate possibility of providing an educational recreational program as a part of the county's unemployment relief responsibility, also to investigate the possibility of using the state armories as community centers.

The latter resolution was offered by Miss Dorothy Mitchell as a result of the talk given by John Bradford of the U. S. Recreational Association in connection with his plea that not only food and raiment be supplied but that provision be made for keeping up the morale of the unemployed by providing activities and education for them as well as a community center where the men may bathe, wash and press their clothes and so assist in maintaining their self respect.

Mr. Bradford took issue with some of those present who would aid only those of legal residence in the county and those who would require labor in all cases in return for assistance given. He estimated that 1500 young people of Medford just out of school and 1500 Medford men would be without work this winter.

Rural Areas Need Told. Representatives from Ashland, Sams Valley, Evans, Union and Lake Creek, Rogue River, McLeod, Bellevue and other districts reported generally that there was greater need than ever before for relief work and indicated in most cases that the individual communities would be able to care for their own needy.

Mrs. A. E. Reames, chairman of the women's division of the committee, who recently attended the Oregon Social Workers Council in Portland, reported that Portland expects to aid 100,000 unemployed and anticipates that another 100,000 in the state outside of Portland must be cared for.

Methods of checking upon applicants for aid and of avoiding duplication are being worked out.

Urgent in Washington. Mrs. Reames reported that Oregon's problem is not as serious as that of Washington state where unrest in some localities is menacing and moral breaking down.

Mr. Fowler commended the work being done by the women's division and told the group that two carloads of tomatoes and pears have been secured to trade with other counties for necessary supplies. Five hundred pounds of salmon have been secured at two and one-half cents a pound cost through the Rogue River Food Bank.

Mr. Donald Clark, food conservation chairman, announced that 2,000 jars of fruit and vegetables have been canned by the local committee in the army and that some salting and drying also have been done. Unemployed women in a few instances have been allowed to aid in canning in exchange for a certain proportion of canned food.

Hural Canning Told. Mrs. Mabel Mack, home demonstration agent, has sent out 1200 cans to the rural districts. Canning kitchens have been functioning in Talent, Eagle Point, Rogue River and Butte Falls. The county office provides a tin can sealer and a pressure cooker for use in the rural districts.

Harry Moore, manager of the local unemployed men's association, pleaded for work for these men who are not asking charity but want work. The work of his organization is about to be abandoned for lack of support. Mr. Moore said and he predicted that the city would have to care for from 400 to 500 families this winter if work cannot be secured soon. He also branded as untrue the report that most of the men of Medford are now unemployed and also said that there are dozens of children hungry in Medford at the present time.

Family Cows Fed. Mrs. H. D. McCahey, a director of the Jackson County Humane Society, told the group that her organization had been assigned by the central committee to continue the work which they have been carrying on for some time of providing food for milk goats, horses, fowl and cows where families dependent upon the animals are unable to secure feed for them. A system of exchange of labor for such fodder advanced by another is being used where possible by the humane society workers.

The superintendent of the Ashland Helping Hand Mission gave a report of Ashland's relief work as did also Mrs. Sam McNeil. The mission is becoming widely known as conducting its relief work in an intelligent and constructive plan.

An increase in the attendance at the Talent schools is expected, as there has been an influx of people to occupy a number of small homes in the vicinity of Talent, and adjacent to the Wagner Creek district. Many of the structures have not been occupied for several months, but are now filling up. Wood and water are handy, and the rent is low.
