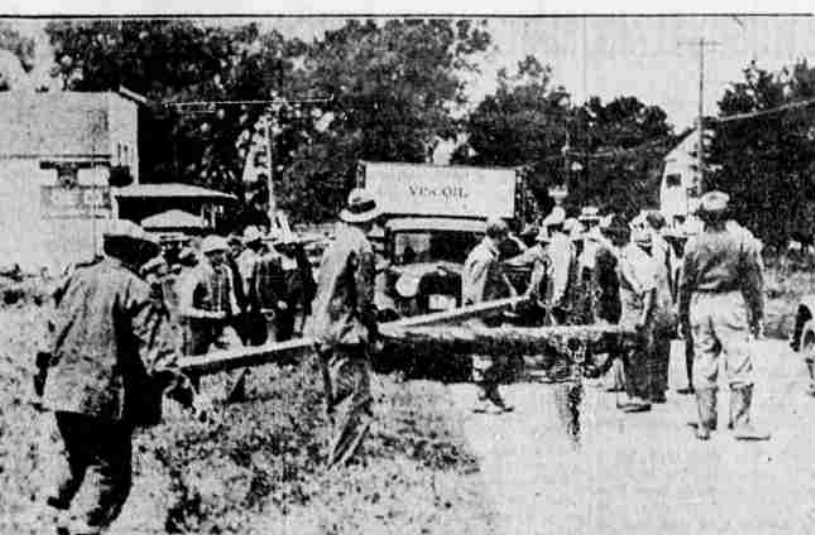

ROWDYISM CURB AND HECKLER BAN FOR LEGION MEET

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 12.—(AP)—Portland hotel proprietors literally cleared their decks for action today. Lobbies of all downtown hotels were denuded of all rugs and movable furniture, except plain board tables and the undertaker parlor variety of chairs. Laundry bags underwent major operations unfitting them for carrying water. All this despite the assurance of Henry L. Stevens, Jr., national commander of the American Legion, that his boys no longer are, if they ever were, rowdies, and episodes at some previous national conventions would not recur. During the convention in Detroit, laundry bags filled with water, were dropped from hotel windows during the Legion parade, and pillows were also open to wait their featherly insides over the roaring thousands. Stevens explained that the "camp-followers" really have been responsible for some of the episodes in the past. The Legion commander invited Portland clergymen to attend the convention sessions to see how decorous the Legion is. At the same time, Stevens requested department commanders to instruct their groups that heckling of "distinguished guests" would be frowned on. Warning the department commanders that in previous conventions hecklers have been "planted" in the audience, Stevens voiced the hope he did not name, would avoid controversial subjects.
