DANE PRESS HITS STUNT BY FAMILY

COPENHAGEN, Sept. 14. (AP) - Before word of their rescue reached here the newspaper Politiken, commenting on the flight, asserted that the Danish government already has been fully justified in refusing permission for their landing in Greenland. The flight served no useful purpose, either scientific or practical, but was merely a sensational stunt, the editorial said.

It added the government knew from previous experience what elaborate precautions are required for a flight over Greenland and also the cost of rescue expeditions.

PEACHES SLUGGISH, TOMATOES ACTIVE, PORTLAND MARTS

PORTLAND, Sept. 14. (AP) - Very heavy supplies greeted buyers on the East Side farmers' wholesale market today. Price changes were limited and practically a standstill as regards advances and declines.

Continued sluggishness is expressed in the peach trade demand. Yakima is hurting its demand by the recurrence of a raid on supplies here by a state inspector as a result of the branding of Elbertas as J. H. Hale by some interests. Elbertas, generally sold 28-30c box, with a few higher, while J. H. Hale were 10c to 15c better generally.

Tomato market was fairly active with selected stock as high as 30c box, while ordinary stuff was 20-25c box.

First Bosc pears of the season were offered out of both Hood River and Mosier and priced 50c box for jumble pack. Some Bartlett's were offered at 30-40c.

First Jonathan apples of the season were offered at \$1 box for local, and were from Yakima. Focal Gravensteins were generally 45-50c box for jumbles.

Potato market was better for locals. Some very good, large-sized stuff sold quickly. 75c orange box, with others around 60-75c box generally.

Dry onions were a trifle slow on account of the abundance of Yakima and Walla Walla stock which dragged. Locals sold 65c for boilers and 70-75c for No. 1 grade.
