

# 100,000 VISITORS AT CRATER LAKE SO FAR THIS YEAR

CRATER LAKE NATIONAL PARK, Ore., Sept. 16.—(Sp.)—Rolling along toward the end, the current travel season has attracted over 100,000 visitors to Crater Lake National Park with the probability several thousand will arrive before the close of the season at the end of this month. Ideal weather conditions the past fortnight have done much to encourage the arrival of visitors, representative of many parts of the United States and foreign countries.

Park concession operations September 20, after which it will no longer be possible to obtain hotel, cabin or food accommodations. Launch trips on the lake were discontinued when all concession boats were stored on Wizard Island for the winter. Nightly community house programs, with their presentations of lectures, musical numbers and moving pictures are also due to be discontinued in a few days.

However, with the possibility weather conditions will be such as to encourage travel for an indefinite time to come, late park visitors will still find camp ground privileges available at the rim, as well as in other sections of the park. Rim caravans around the lake will be continued as long as demand for such service warrants.

The Sinnott Memorial, observation station and museum, located on Victor Rock near the lodge, will remain open to visitors dependent on weather conditions, which at the present time, with a succession of ideal Indian summer days, make a visit to Crater Lake a true delight in autumn months. Visits are further attractively enhanced by short hikes from the rim road to "The Watchman" viewpoint, first high elevation on the northwest rim and up to the summit of Garfield Peak. In spring lake and mountain panoramas are possible from these two vantage points.

## ERIN DOLLARS IN BANK SHOW GAIN

DUBLIN, Sept. 16.—(AP)—A great dollar current has been flowing into Ireland for nearly a year. Soaring bank deposits which have puzzled the public are now explained.

The greater part of the \$6,375,000 increased deposits of the national bank and the \$4,733,000 increase in the Munster and Leitner bank holdings have come from the United States.

Formerly American prosperity explained the drift of dollars to Ireland. Now it is the economic crisis. Many Irish-Americans who feared losses in bank failures, have been transferring their funds to banks here. Also returning Irishmen, who found the future not too good in the United States, have brought their savings to the homeland.

## 1,500 MEN BATTLE VENTURA BLAZE

VENTURA, Cal., Sept. 16.—(AP)—Nearly 1,500 men were waging a losing battle against fire in the Santa Barbara National forest today. Aided by a strong wind from the ocean, the flames were increasing in their intensity, and sweeping over thousands of acres of valuable watershed land.

In the ten days the fire has been in progress, approximately 125,000 acres of timber and brush land have been burned over, numerous mountain homes destroyed and there has been a heavy loss of life among game and wild animals.

## WARSHIP SPEEDS; ADMIRAL IS ILL

SAN PEDRO, Calif., Sept. 16.—(AP)—With Vice-Admiral Joel R. P. Pringle critically ill aboard the ship, the battleship West Virginia was speeding today toward San Diego from Port Angeles, Wash., where an operation for an abdominal ailment was to be performed.

Dr. A. B. Cecil, Los Angeles specialist, is awaiting the arrival of the dreadnaught at the naval hospital in San Diego.

Admiral Pringle, 59, next in line for the post of chief of naval operations, was stricken while his ship was maneuvering in Puget Sound.

## ROOSEVELT TRAIN KILLS TWO COWS

ABOARD ROOSEVELT SPECIAL, Sept. 16.—(AP)—The campaign train of Gov. Roosevelt removed two yearlings from the available supply of beef cattle in Kansas today.

Speeding westward through the cattle lands, the train bore down upon the animals with a series of whistle blasts and screeching brakes. It stopped for a few minutes while one yearling was removed from the cow-catcher.

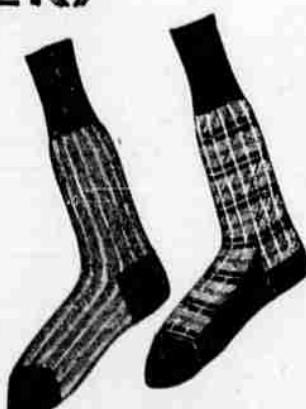

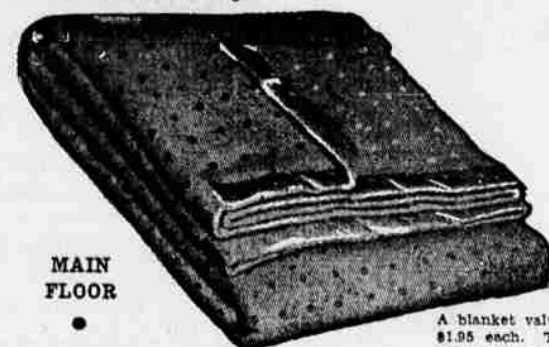
